ESTABLISH A SAFE SOUND LEVEL

- Over time your hearing will adapt to continuous loud sounds and will give the
 impression that the volume has in fact been reduced. What seems normal to you
 may in fact be harmful. To guard against this BEFORE YOUR HEARING
 ADAPTS set the volume at a low level.
- Slowly increase the level until you can hear comfortably and clearly and without distortion.
- Damage to your hearing is accumulative and is irreversible.
- Any ringing or discomfort in the ears indicates that the volume is too loud.
- Remember listening for prolonged period of time at high volume levels will harm your hearing.

Once you have established a comfortable listening level, DO NOT INCREASE THE SOUND LEVEL FURTHER.

The following list of typical sound levels may assist you in recognising just how loud you have set the volume level.

DECIBEL

Level dB	Example
30dB	Quiet library, soft whisper.
40	Living room, fridge freezer bedroom away from traffic.
50	Normal conversation, quiet office, light traffic.
60	Electric sewing machine,
70	Vacuum cleaner, hair dryer, noisy restaurant



WARNING: UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES MUST THE LIVE OR NEUTRAL WIRES BE CONNECTED TO THE EARTH TERMINAL IN 3-PIN MAINS PLUG.

This symbol means that this unit is double insulated.

An earth connected is not required.

CAUTION: WHEN OPERATING THIS UNIT ON 230V MAINS SUPPLY. PLEASE NOTE THAT WHEN THE POWER SWITCH IS IN THE OFF MODE. THIS DOES NOT DISCONNECT THE UNIT FROM THE MAINS SUPPLY. HOWEVER, PLEASE BE ASSURED THAT IT IS PERFECTLY SAFE TO LEAVE THE UNIT CONNECTED TO THE MAINS SUPPLY.


PRE FITTED MAINS PLUGS

For your convenience a mains plug with a fuse has been fitted to this appliance. For your safety please observe the following information.

- Should the fuse fail in the plug remove the plug from the wall socket and replace the fuse with a 3 Amp ASTA approved to BS 1362 fuse.
- Never use the plug without the fuse cover fitted. Replacement fuse covers are available from your dealer or most electrical retail outlets.
- If the mains plug is cut off from the cable, rewire the replacement plug in accordance with the instruction given in this manual.
- 4. CAUTION: Under no circumstances should the discarded plug be inserted into the mains socket. To prevent a shock hazard carefully dispose of the discarded plug. Do not leave the plug lying around where children might see it.

WARNING: To prevent fire or shock hazard do not expose this unit to rain or moisture.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

CLEANING THE UNIT

(REMOVE MAINS PLUG FROM MAINS OUTLET SOCKET)

To clean the unit, simply wipe off with a soft clean cloth moistened with plain lukewarm water.

CLEANING THE TAPE HEAD

To ensure the continued high performance of your unit, periodically clean the heads an pinch roller to prevent accumulation of dust or tape oxide deposits by using a special tape head cleaning cassette, available at record and tape stores everywhere. Failure to clean these parts may result in inferior sound quality, distortion of recorded sound, sound quality, distortion of recorded sound, deterioration of high frequencies, and inconsistent tape speed.

CAUTION

- Screwdrivers and other metal objects should NEVER be allowed to come in contact with the tape heads. These will scratch the sensitive surface causing damage to your tapes.
- Magnets or magnetized objects should not be placed near tape heads.

COMPACT DISC

Handling the disc

Although the music tracks in the disc are covered with a protective layer it is still advisable to treat the disc carefully. Ensure that you always pick up discs by the edge, and put them back in their holders immediately after using.





Cleaning the disc

Cleaning will not normally be necessary. However, should fingerprints, dust or dirt appear, you can wipe them off with a soft, tint-tree cloth wipe the disc in straight line from centre to edge. You can moisten the disc first if necessary, but detergent for abrasive cleaning agents for conventional records.





COMPACT DISC PLAYER

The player mechanism is fitted with self-lubricating hearings, and must not be oiled or greased.

TAPE PRECAUTIONS

Recommended Cassette Tapes

In order to obtain optimum performance with the built-in cassette tape deck, it is essential to use only high quality cassette tapes. The bias and equalization of this tape deck is adjusted to yield excellent results if used with brand name tapes. Use C-30, C-60 and C-90 cassette tapes only. We do not recommend the C-120 cassettes because they can be subject to mechanical instability and proper constant tape tension

Checking the Cassette (Slack Tape) Make sure that the cassette tape has no slack prior to inserting it into the cassette compartment. Unless the tape is taut, it may wind around the head mechanism and trouble may result. Use a pencil as shown to take up slack on one of the reels.

Record Button Interlock - Accident Erasure protection

Remove the tab as illustrated so that the record mode does not function when the record button is pressed.



To record on a cassette once tabs have been removed simply cover the slot with plastic tape.



INTRODUCTION

Please read these instructions carefully before using this product and retain them in a safe place for future reference.

POWER SUPPLY

This Product can be powered by either 230V AC Mains supply or by 8 UM-2 " C "size Alkaline batteries.

AC OPERATION

Remove the AC cord which is packed inside the box.

Connect the cord to the AC input socket.

Connect the 3 pin mains plug to an AC mains socket.

BATTERY OPERATION

- Insert 8 UM-2 (C Size) batteries (not supplied) into the battery compartment observing the correct polarity as indicated.
- 2. Ensure compartment cover is securely fitted.
- 3. Product will only function from batteries once AC cord is removed from the unit.
- 4. When replacing flat batteries, ensure all batteries are replaced at the same time with the same type.
- 5. If the product is not to be used for an extended period of time the batteries should be removed to prevent any possible damage to the product.

LASER SAFETY

This unit employs a laser, only qualified service personnel should attempt repair.





USING THE RADIO

- 1. Switch the function selector to RADIO.
- Switch the BAND selector to either FM, FM ST. or MW as required.

FM BAND

- 3. If the FM band is selected, ensure the telescopic aerial is fully extended and positioned vertically.
- Rotate the TUNING control until the desired station is located.
- If the station is broadcasting in stereo, the stereo indicator will illuminate. To listen to the broadcast in stereo the BAND switch should be set to FM ST.
- To achieve optimum reception adjust the position of the telescopic aerial.
- If the received station is weak or noisy, select FM position(MONO).

MW BAND

For MW reception, the product has an in built aerial to achieve best reception the unit should be rotated until the best reception is obtained.

GENERAL

Once the required station has been located adjust the volume control to the desired level.

USING THE CASSETTE

NORMAL PLAYBACK

- 1. Switch the function selector to TAPE.
- Press the STOP/EJECT key to open the cassette compartment and insert a pre-recorded tape with the exposed portion of the tape facing uppermost and the full spool to the right. Gently push the door to close.
- Press the PLAY key to start playback, adjusting the VOLUME to the desired level.
- 4. To briefly suspend playback press the PAUSE key, releasing it resumes playback.
- To advance or rewind the tape rapidly press the FAST FORWARD or REWIND keys.
- To stop playback press the STOP/EJECT key, press it down fully to EJECT the cassette.
- NOTE: When the cassette reaches its end during playback or recording, the mechanism will stop and the keys will return to their normal position.

USING THE CASSETTE

RECORDING

Please note Chrome or Metal tapes are not recommended for use with this product.

- Insert a blank tape with the recording tabs intact into the tape compartment.
- Operate the desired function and select the material to be recorded.
- Press the RECORD key, the PLAY key will automatically engage.
- The product has an inbuilt ALC circuit, which automatically adjust the record level for the best quality recording.
- To temporarily stop or edit the recording press the PAUSE key.
- 6. To stop recording press the STOP/EJECT key.

USING THE CD PLAYER

PLAYING A CD

- 1. Switch the function Selector to CD.
- Press the CD lid OPEN button and insert a disc with the label side facing uppermost. Gently close the lid.
- After a few seconds, the unit will scan the disc and the display will show the total number of tracks on the disc. If the disc is incorrectly inserted or defective the display will show " - - ".
- 4. Press the PLAY/PAUSE button to start playback, the PLAY/PAUSE indicator will show in the display, adjust the VOLUME to the desired level. The current track being played will be shown in the display.
- To temporarily pause playback press the PLAY/PAUSE button, the PLAY/PAUSE indicator will flash in the display. To resume playback press this button again.
- To stop playback press the STOP button. The display will show the total number of tracks on the disc. This remains in the display until either the disc is removed or another function is selected.
- To skip up or down tracks on the disc press either SEARCH SKIP UP or DOWN Buttons.

NOTE: Always press the stop button before removing a disc.

* BBS

The Bass Boost (BBS) Button is used to enhauce bass boost sound.

USING THE CD PLAYER

REPEAT PLAY

- To repeat the track currently being played press the REPEAT button once the repeat indicator will flash in the display.
- 2. To repeat the entire disc (continuous play) press the REPEAT button twice the repeat indicator will remain (non-flashing) in the display.
- To return to normal play mode press the REPEAT button until the repeat indicator disappears from the display, or press STOP button.


PROGRAMME PLAY

- Press PROG button in stop mode, " Pr " and PROG lamp will flash.
- 2. Press SKIP/SEARCH buttons either ₩or ➤ until the desired track shows on the display.
- Press PROG button to store the track you selected, "Pr" and PROG lamp keeps flashing, waiting for your next selection.
- Repeat steps 2 & 3 to program other additional tracks. (Up to 20 tracks can be programmed)

LOCATION OF CONTROLS (REMOTE CONTROL)

- 1. STOP Press to stop disc play.
- PLAY/PAUSE Press once to start playback of CD disc.

 Press again to pause play.
- 3. PROG To program playback.
- 4. REPEAT To repeat palyback.
- SKIP DOWN press to skip to previous track.
- SKIP UP Press to skip up to next track.
