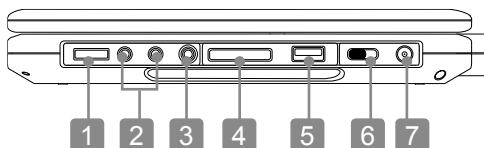

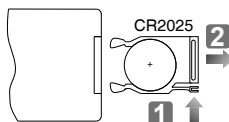
## Remote Control Operation Range

Point the remote control unit no more than 6 meters from the sensor and within 60° of the front of the unit.



## Battery Installation for the Remote Control

Push **1** and pull **2** to open the battery compartment. Insert the battery and match the (+) and (-) on battery to the indicated marks.



### Recharging the Battery

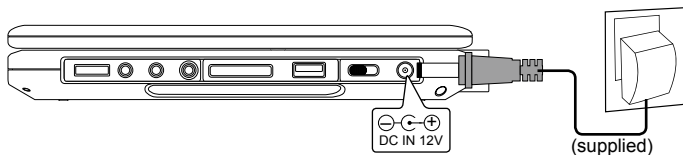
If you want to use the internal rechargeable battery as the portable dvd player's main power, please fully charge the internal rechargeable battery before using the player for the first time. This charging procedure requires approximately four hours.

- 1 Power off the player.
- 2 Connect the AC adapter to the DC IN socket on the player and to power outlet.
- 3 The LED indicator will light up red when the battery is charging. The LED indicator will turn off when the battery is charged completely.



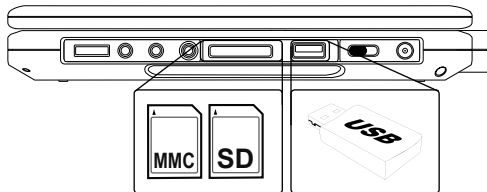
**Note:**

1. **The internally fitted rechargeable battery is factory fitted and is designed to last for the life time of this product.**
2. *The battery cannot be charged whilst playing a disc.*



### Insert memory card and USB flash drive

- 1 Insert MMC/SD memory card into memory slot or insert USB flash drive into USB port.
- 2 To remove MMC/SD card, gently push in the card to eject it from the slot.



## How to Use In a Vehicle

For using the portable DVD player in a vehicle, please read the following instructions:



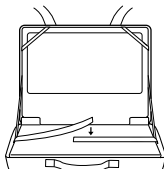
**Note:**

- It is illegal for the driver of the vehicle to view the DVD player whilst the vehicle is in motion.

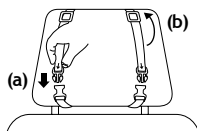
**STEP 1. Pack your portable DVD player into the carry bag.**



**STEP 2. Adjust the elastic straps and tighten it securely; then fasten the straps with the velcro.**



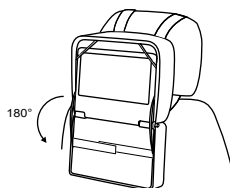
**STEP 3. Attach the bag to the headrest part by two steps.**  
 (a) Snap the buckles together.  
 (b) Adjust the straps with the stoppers.



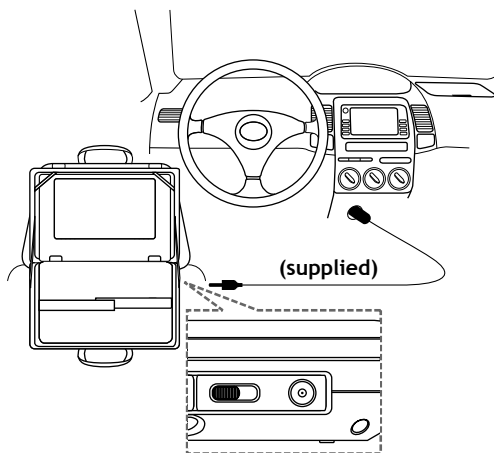
**STEP 4.**

**Flatten this unit.**

*If you want to place a disc when releasing the velcro, please be careful or the player would slip out.*



**STEP 5.** Connect the cigar adaptor plug to the power socket on the portable DVD player, the other end to the cigar lighter socket.

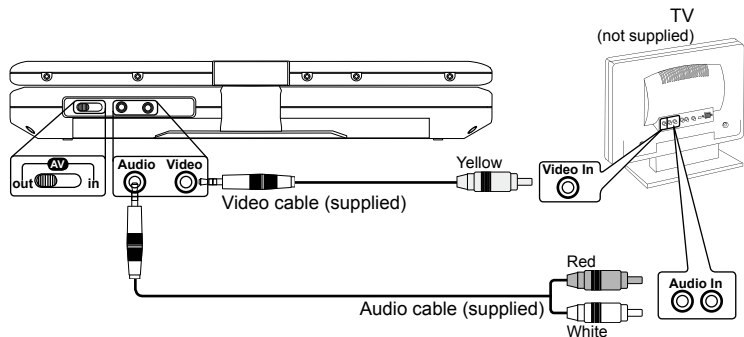




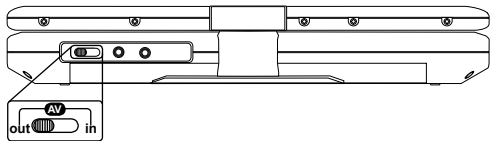
## Connections

**Connect to TV**

- 1 Switch to AV out.
- 2 Connect the AV Out of the DVD Player to the Audio and Video In of your TV with an Audio/Video Cable.

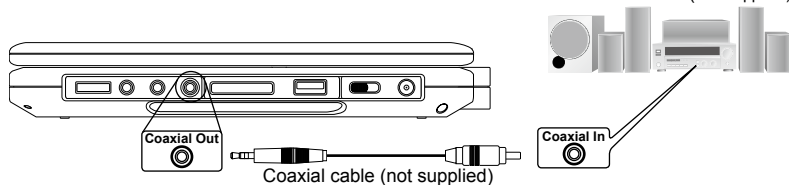
**Connect to Other Equipment**

- 1 Switch to AV out.



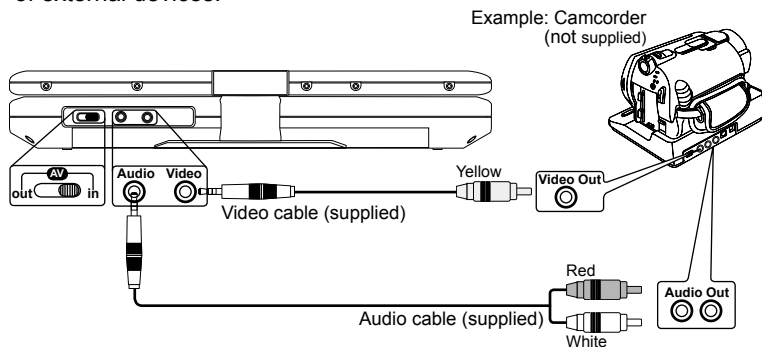
- 2 Connect the Coaxial Out of the DVD Player to the Coaxial In of external devices.

## Input from External Equipment

- 1 Switch to AV In.
- 2 Connect the Audio/Video In of the DVD Player to the Audio/Video Out of external devices.



### Basic DVD Playback




- 1 Turn on the player. Press  **Eject** to open the disc cover.
- 2 Hold the edge of the disc to put it in the disc tray with the printed side up.
- 3 Close disc cover.
  - Close the disc cover and the portable DVD player starts playback if the disc does not have any menus recorded on it.
  - If the disc has one or more titles recorded on it, a menu screen will appear on the screen.
- 4 To play a title, press  **Up** /  **Down** /  **Left** /  **Right** or **Number Button(s)** to highlight it and then press  **Play/Sel..**

### Stopping Playback and Returning to the Menu Screen



(If a Menu Screen is Available on the Disc)

Press  **Menu**.




### Stopping Playback

- 1 Press  **Stop** once to enter prestop mode. In prestop status, the disc can be played from where the playback has been stopped by pressing  **Play/Sel..**
- 2 To completely stop the disc playback, press  **Stop** again.














### Pausing Playback

- 1 Press  **Pause**.
- 2 To return to normal playback, press  **Play/Sel..**

### Frame Advance (Step)


- 1 Press  **Pause** to pause playback.
  - The disc is advanced by one frame each time pressing  **Pause**.
- 2 To return to normal playback, press  **Play/Sel..**

### Fast Forward and Backward


- 1 Press  **Fast Forward** or  **Fast Backward** during playback.  
The speed of advance (x2, x4, x8 and x20) or reverse (x2, x4, x8 and x20) changes for each press of  **Fast Forward** or  **Fast Backward**.
- 2 To return to normal playback, press  **Play/Sel..**

### Skipping a Chapter Ahead or Back



#### Skipping Ahead

- Press  **Next** during playback.
- Skip a chapter each time pressing the button.


#### Skipping Back




- Press  **Previous** during playback.
- When pressing the button once midway through a chapter, the player returns to the beginning of the chapter being played back. The player skips a chapter each time you press the button.

### Muting the Player




- 1 Press  **Mute**.
- 2 To resume the sound, press  **Mute** again.

### Repeat Viewing



During playback, press  **1/All Repeat** repeatedly to select the following options:

-  Chapter: Repeat Chapter
-  Title: Repeat Title
-  Off: Repeat Off

### Displaying Scene Information

- 1 Press  **Info.** during playback
  - Press  **Info.** a number of times, the title number, chapter number, and other information will show on the screen.
- 2 To stop displaying scene information, press  **Info.** a number of times until the information disappears.

### Changing Audio Soundtrack Language




- 1 Press  **Audio** during playback.
- 2 Press  **Audio** a number of times until a preferred language is selected.





#### Note:

- When the preferred language is not selected even after pressing the button several times, it may indicate that language is not available on the disc.

### Changing Subtitle Languages

- 1 Press  **Subtitle** during playback.
- 2 Press  **Subtitle** a number of times until a preferred language is selected.
- 3 To clear the subtitle display, press  **Subtitle** until **Subtitle: OFF** appears on the screen.

### Viewing from Different Angles








- 1 Press  **Angle** during playback.
- 2 Press  **Angle** a number of times until the preferred viewing angle is selected.





#### Note:

- This operation works only with discs on which multiple viewing angles are recorded.

### Using a DVD Menu

- 1 Press  **Title** in stop mode. The DVD menu available on the disc appears.
- 2 Press  **Up** /  **Down** /  **Left** /  **Right** to select the preferred item.
- 3 Press  **Play/Sel.** to enter to the selected item.
- 4 To return to the previous menu screen, press  **Title**.

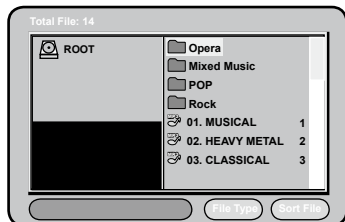
### Using the Menu Function

- 1 Press  **Play/Sel.**
- 2 Press  **Menu**.
- 3 Press  **Up** /  **Down** /  **Left** /  **Right** or **Number Button(s)** to select the preferred title.

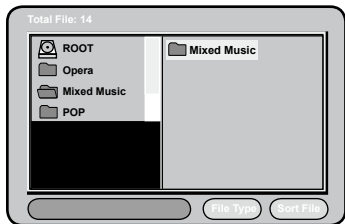
## Basic Audio CDs Playback

1 Load an Audio CD, a MMC/SD card or an USB Flash Drive. Press **(Mode)**, then press **(Up / Down)** to highlight the source you want to play, and press **(Play/Sel.)** **Play/Sel.** to confirm.

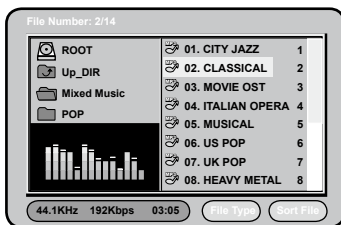
- For audio CDs without playback control, the DVD player starts playback.
- For audio CDs provided with playback control, a menu appears after a few seconds.



2 To play a music track in the menu, press **(Up / Down)** to highlight a folder on the right of the screen, and then press **(Play/Sel.)** **Play/Sel.**



3 Press **(Play/Sel.)** **Play/Sel.** to play the music.



## Stopping Playback

Press **(Stop)** **Stop.**

## Pausing Playback

- Press **(Pause)** **Pause.**
- To return to normal playback, press **(Play/Sel.)** **Play/Sel..**

## Displaying Track Information

- Press **(Info)** **Info.** during playback.
- To stop displaying track information, press **(Info)** **Info.** again.

- Some music tracks may not display any information when you press **(Info)** **Info** button.

## Skipping a Track Ahead or Back

### Skipping Ahead

Press **(Next)** **Next** during playback.

- Skip a track each time you press the button.

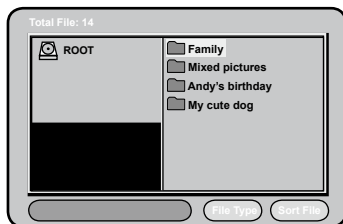
### Skipping Back

Press **(Previous)** **Previous** during playback.

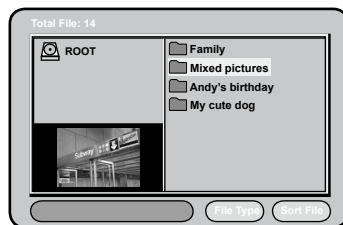
- When you press the button once midway through a track, the player returns to the beginning of the track being played back. The player skips a track each time you press the button.

## Basic Picture CDs Playback

- 1 Load a Picture CD, a MMC/SD card or an USB Flash Drive. Press **Mode**, then press **Up** / **Down** to highlight the source you want to play, and press **Play/Sel.** to confirm.
  - For Kodak Picture CDs, the DVD player starts slide show playback.
  - For picture CDs with a menu screen, the menu appears after a few seconds.
- 2 Press **Up** / **Down** to highlight a folder on the right screen, and then press **Play/Sel.**



- 3 Press **Up** / **Down** to highlight a picture on the right screen, then the picture review will show on the left bottom screen.



- 4 To play picture slide show, press **Play/Sel.**

## Pausing Playback

- 1 Press **Pause** playback.
- 2 To return to normal playback, press **Play/Sel.**

## Rotating Pictures

Press **Fast Forward** during playback to rotate the picture clockwise by 90° or press **Fast Backward** to rotate the picture counter-clockwise by 90°.

## Viewing the Next or Previous Picture

Press **Next** to view the next picture or **Previous** to view the previous picture.

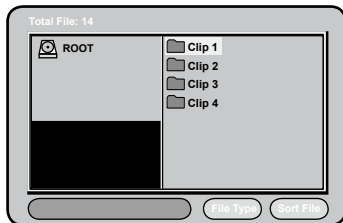
## Thumbnail Function

- 1 Press **Stop** while you are playing the slide show.
- 2 Press **Up** / **Down** / **Left** / **Right** to select the preferred picture.
- 3 Press **Play/Sel.** to play.

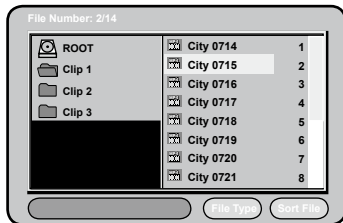
## Basic MPEG-4 Playback

- 1 Load a disc or MMC/SD card containing MPEG-4 files. Press **(Mode)** **Mode**, then press **(Up)** **Up** / **(Down)** **Down** to highlight the source you want to play, and press **(Play/Sel.)** **Play/Sel.** to confirm.

- 2 Press **(Up)** **Up** / **(Down)** **Down** to highlight a folder and then press **(Play/Sel.)** **Play/Sel.**.



- 3 Press **(Up)** **Up** / **(Down)** **Down** to highlight a file, and then press **(Play/Sel.)** **Play/Sel.** to play the file.



## Stopping Playback

To stop playback and return to the menu screen, press **(Stop)** **Stop**.

## Pausing Playback

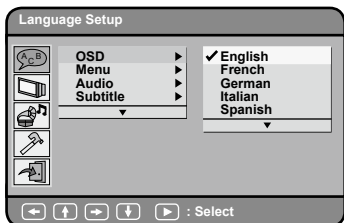

- 4:3 Pan Scan** : Select "4:3 PanScan" for a conventional size TV set.



- 4:3 Letter Box** : Select "4:3 Letter Box" for a conventional size TV set. Black bands appear at top and bottom of screen (letter-box style).

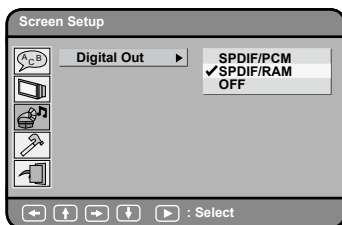
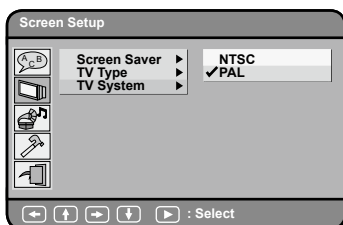


- 16:9 Wide** : Select "16:9 Wide" for a wide-screen TV set to played in "FULL" size.



## TV System

- 3 Press **Right**, then press **Up** / **Down** to select **TV System**.
- 4 Press **Right**, then press **Up** / **Down** to select the TV system, it depends on the system is used in your location.
- 5 Press **Play/Sel.** to confirm.

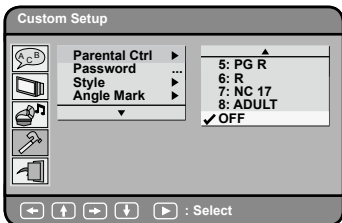

## Rating Explanations

- 1. KID:** Kid safe; it is safe even for kids.
- 2. G:** General audience; recommended as acceptable for viewers of all ages.
- 3. PG:** Parental Guidance suggested.
- 4. PG-13:** Material is unsuitable for children under the age of 13.
- 5. PG-R:** Parental Guidance-restricted; recommended that parents restrict children under age 17 from viewing or allow children to view only when supervised by a parent or adult guardian.
- 6. R:** Restricted, children under 17 would not be admitted without an accompanying parent or adult guardian.
- 7. NC-17:** No children under the age of 17, not recommended viewing for children under age 17.
- 8. ADULT:** Adult only.

- Do not** install the monitor and DVD Player near any heat sources, such as radiators, stoves, or other devices that produce heat.
- Do not** use this apparatus near water (for example, sinks, tubs, and pools) or expose it to rain, moisture, or dripping or splashing liquids. No objects filled with water (such as vases) should be placed on the apparatus.
- Do not** attempt to service or repair the monitor & DVD Player yourself. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.

### Cleaning

Unplug the unit and turn power off before cleaning this unit.

### **IMPORTANT AUDIO SAFETY**

Your hearing is very important to you and to us, so please take care when operating this equipment. It is strongly recommended that you follow the listed guidelines in order to prevent possible damage to or loss of hearing.

#### **Establish a safe sound level**

Over time your hearing will adapt to continuous loud sounds and will give the impression that the volume has in fact been reduced. What seems normal to you may in fact be harmful. To guard against this before your hearing adapts set the volume at a low level.

**DO NOT** use non-circular DVD discs, otherwise it may lead to damage to this DVD player.

In order to keep the disc surface clean, please hold the DVD disc by its edge.

**DO NOT** touch the recorded surface of DVD disc.

**DO NOT** stick anything on the surface of DVD disc. If there is glue and other adhesive article, please remove it before loading the disc.

**DO NOT** leave the disc in direct sunlight.

**DO NOT** leave the disc near a heat source, such as heating pipe.

**DO NOT** leave a disc inside a car under direct sunlight.

After Playback, always remove the disc from the player and return it to the display/storage case.

To clean discs, use a dry soft cloth moving the cloth from the centre to the outside across the disc surface. **DO NOT** use a rotary motion as this can make the disc unplayable.

**DO NOT** use Petroleum products or aggressive cleaning agents, as these will damage the disc.

### Use of the in car power lead

This lead is specially designed for the unit. **DO NOT** use it for other in car products as this may result in damage to lead or the other equipment.



**Please read these precautions before operating this player.**

### ■ Placement

Avoid placing the player in areas of:

- direct sunlight radiators, or closed automobiles
- high temperature (over 35°C) or high humidity (over 90%)
- large amounts of dust as the internal parts may be seriously damaged

### ■ Non-use periods

When the player is not being used, turn it off. When left unused for a long period of time, the player should be unplugged from the household mains supply.

### ■ Do not insert fingers or other objects inside unit

- Touching internal parts of this unit is dangerous, and may cause serious damage to the player. Do not attempt to disassemble the player.
- Do not put any foreign object onto the player on the disc tray.

### ■ Keep away from water/magnet

- Keep the player away from flower vases, tubs, sinks, etc. If liquids are spilled into the player, serious damage could occur.
- Never bring a magnet or magnetized object near the player.

### ■ Stacking

- Place the player in a horizontal position, and do not place anything heavy on it.

### ■ Condensation

Moisture may form on the lens in the following conditions:

- immediately after a heater has been turned on
- in a steamy or very humid room
- when the player is suddenly moved from a cold environment to a warm one

If moisture forms inside this player, it may not operate properly. In this case, turn on the power and wait for one hour for the moisture to evaporate.

Before requesting service for the DVD Player, check the chart below for a possible cause of the problem you are experiencing. Some simple checkups or a minor adjustment on your part may eliminate the problem and restore proper operation.

The player starts playback but stops immediately.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The disc may be dirty and may require cleaning.</li> <li>Ensure that the disc is correctly placed in the disc frame.</li> </ul>
No picture.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Ensure that the equipment is connected properly.</li> <li>Select the same channel and source on the TV as on the player.</li> </ul>
No sound.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Ensure that the equipment is connected properly.</li> </ul>
Distorted sound.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Ensure that the input settings for the TV and stereo system are proper.</li> <li>No sound is heard during still picture (pause) or slow-motion playback.</li> </ul>
No audio at Digital Output.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Check the digital connections.</li> <li>Check the settings menu to make sure that the digital output is set to on.</li> <li>Check if the audio format of the selected audio language matches your receiver capabilities.</li> </ul>

## Handling Precautions

- Hold the disc by the edges so the surface will not be soiled with finger-prints. (A)
- Fingerprints, dirt and scratches can cause skipping and distortion.
- Do not write on the label side with a ball-point pen or other writing utensils.
- Do not use record cleaning sprays, benzine, thinner, static electricity prevention liquids or any other solvent.
- Be careful not to drop or bend the disc.
- Do not install more than 1 disc on the disc tray.
- Do not try to close the disc tray when the disc is not installed properly.
- Be sure to store the disc in its exclusive case when not in use.

## If the surface is soiled (B)

Wipe gently with a soft, damp (water only) cloth.

When wiping discs, always move the cloth from the center hole toward the outer edge.

(If you wipe the discs using a circular motion, circular scratches are likely to occur, which will cause noise.)

If the disc is brought from a cold to a warm environment, moisture may form on the disc

Wipe the moisture off with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth before using the disc.

## Improper disc storage

You can damage discs if you store them in the following places:

- Areas exposed to direct sunlight
- Humid or dusty areas
- Areas directly exposed to a heat outlet or heating appliance

- DivX, MPEG4, DVD, DVD+RW, DVD+R, DVD-RW, DVD-R, CD-DA, Mixed CD-DA, JPEG file disc and Kodak Picture Disc.

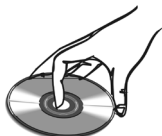

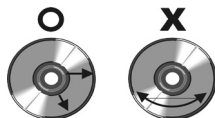
## Maintenance

- Be sure to turn the unit off and disconnect the AC power cord before maintaining the unit.
  - Wipe this unit with a dry soft cloth.
- If the surfaces are extremely dirty, wipe clean with a cloth which has been dipped in a weak soap-and-water solution and wrung out thoroughly, and then wipe again with a dry cloth.
- Never use alcohol, benzine, thinner, cleaning fluid or other chemicals.
- And do not use compressed air to remove dust.
