CONNECTIONS TO MAINS SUPPLY

This appliance may be fitted with a non-rewineable plug. If it is necessary to change the fuse in a non-rewineable plug the fuse cover must be refitted. If the fuse cover is lost or damaged, the plug must not be used until a replacement available from the appliance manufacturer is obtained. It is important that the colour of the replacement fuse cover corresponds with the colour marking on the base of the plug.

If the plug has to be changed because it is not autable for your socket, or becomes damaged, it should be cut off and an appropriate plug fitted following the wining instructions below. The plug removed must be disposed of safety as insertion into a 13A socket is likely to cause an electrical hazard.

This unit is designed to operate on 230V, 50 Hz current only. Connecting it to other power sources may damage the unit. The wires in this mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following code :

As the colours of the wires in the mains lead of this appliance may not correspond with the coloured makrings identifying the terminals in your plug, proceed as follows:-

> The wine which is coloured blue must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter N or coloured black.

The whe which is cloured brown must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter L or coloured red.

No connection is to be made to the earth terminal of the plug.

If a 13 Amp (BS 1363) Plug is used, a 3Amp Fuse must be fitted, or if any other type of Plug is used a 5 Amp Fuse must be fitted, either in the Plug, or on the Distribution Board.





Turning the unit on/off

Press the **POWER** button on the front of the unit or the **POWER** button on the remote control.



Note: when you use the power button to turn the unit off, it is not disconnected from the mains AC supply. This state is called the standby mode.

Screen Saver

Television screens can sometimes be damaged by displaying a static images for prolonged periods of time. To prevent this, the DVD player is equipped with an automatic screen saver to protect your television screen.



Pressing any button will deactivate the screen saver.

The Remote Control

Installing The batteries

Locate the remote control, and remove the battery cover.

Insert two AAA size batteries into the compartment.



Note: Refer to the diagram inside the battery compartment for correct installation of batteries.



Using The Remote Control

To use the remote control, point it at the front of the DVD player, towards the sensor situated to the right of the DVD drawer.

The remote control has a range of up to 6 meters from the DVD player and at an angle of up to 60 degrees.

Do not block the path of the beam from the remote control to the DVD player.





Region code

Since it is usual for DVD movies to be released at different times in different regions of the world, all players have region codes and discs can have an optional region code. If you load a disc of a different region code into your player you will see the region code notice on the screen. The disc will not playback and should be unloaded.

The region code for this player is 2 as indicated by the symbols below.



Inserting A Disc

Ensure the DVD player is connected to the mains and is correctly connected to your television.

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Note: For instructions how to connect your DVD player to your television see the "Connecting To External Equipment" section (p9-12).

Press the **POWER** button on the front of your DVD player.

Press the **EJECT** button to open the DVD drawer.

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Note: OPEN will show on the DVD display panel and the top left of the screen.

Place a compatible disc into the recess on the DVD disc tray. Make sure that the label is facing up. Place 8cm discs on the inner recess.



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Note: for a list of compatible disc formats see page 13

Press the EJECT button to close the DVD drawer.



Note: When the drawer has closed **LOAD** will show on the DVD display and **Loading** will be displayed in the top left corner of the screen.

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

Change password



You can change the current password by selecting CHANGE PASSWORD and pressing the **PLAY/SEL** button, the following menu will be displayed.





You will need to enter the current password (initially set to 0000) then press the **PLAY/SEL** button

Then type in your new password, press the **PLAY/SEL** button.

To return the DVD player to the factory settings, highlight the **DEFAULT** setting and press the **RIGHT ARROW** button to select READ and then press the **PLAY/SEL** button.

Viewing Frame by Frame



Press the **PAUSE/STEP** button to pause the playback.

Each time you press the **PAUSE/STEP** button the still picture advances to the next frame.



Note: The pause symbol and play **III** symbol will be displayed on the screen.

Pressing **PLAY/SEL** returns to the normal playback mode.

Stopping Playback



Press the STOP button.



The A-B function allows a selected portion of any length to be repeated.

When the film reaches the beginning of the section you want to repeat, press the **REPEAT A-B** button. "**Rep. A**" will be displayed on the screen.

Press the **REPEAT A-B** button again, when the film reaches the end of the section you want to repeat. "**Rep. A-B**" will be displayed on the screen.



Note: The selected portion will be repeated until the function is cancelled.

To cancel the A-B function, press the **REPEAT A-B** button again.

Selecting a Scene Angle



Note: the multi-angle feature may not be available on all scenes on a disc and may not be available on all discs.



Each time you press the ANGLE button, the scene angle changes.

If there are no other angles available,⊘ will be displayed

Subtitle Function



Press the **SUBTITLE** button repeatedly to cycle through the available languages.



Note: See the DVD disc cover for supported languages.

Audio Function



Press the **AUDIO** button repeatedly to cycle through the available audio tracks



Note: See the DVD disc cover for details

Display Function

The **INFO** button is used to display information about the current disc.

Note: The display function can also be used with audio and mp3 discs. Although, different displays will be shown.



Note: **OPEN** will show on the DVD display panel and will be displayed in the corner of the screen.

Place a disc containing the mp3 files into the recess on the DVD disc tray. Make sure that the label is facing up. Place 8cm discs on the inner recess.

Press the EJECT button to close the DVD drawer.



Note: When the drawer has closed **LOAD** will show on the DVD display and **Loading....** will be displayed in the corner of the screen.

Program Function - Audio and MP3 Discs

The program function can be used to play a user preset sequence.



Press the **PROGRAM** button.

PROGRAM		

The cursor will be placed at the first program location.

Use the numeric buttons to enter the track number and then press the **PLAY/SEL** button.

The cursor will move to the next program location.

Use the numeric buttons to enter the next track number.

Continue to enter the tracks as required. A maximum of 9 entries can be entered.



Once all the entries have been entered, press the **PLAY/SEL** button to start the program sequence. The track number and elapsed track time will be displayed.

Playing Kodak picture CDs or JPEG picture CDs

Basic playback

Load a Kodak picture CD or a JPEG picture CD into the CD tray. After a few seconds, the unit shows the pictures 1 by 1 on the screen.

Pause, Next and Prev

Press the **PAUSE/STEP** button to pause the slideshow.

During pause mode, press the **PREV** or **NEXT** button to view the next or previous image.

Rotating (Kodak picture CD only)

Operating The FM Radio

After operating the DVD Player it is possible to listen to the inbuilt FM radio. Leave all connections the same as for watching the DVD Player. The TV must be switched on to allow you to hear the audio from the radio, The TV will not display the tuner frequency or functions use the FL display on the DVD player.

Ensure that the Wire aerial is connected to the aerial input socket located at the rear of the player. Fully unravel and position it for best reception

Press the DVD/Tuner button on the remote. The Blue Goodmans splash screen will disappear leaving just a blank screen. This is to protect the TV screen from being burnt through long exposure without a moving image

The display on the DVD Player will show a 4 digit frequency. Now press the Tuning -/+ (F.Bwd or F.Fwd) button to search through the FM band. The tuning will automatically stop at the first station received. The audio will be heard through your TV. Adjust the volume level accordingly on the remote or TV.

Storing Stations(30 Preset Memory)

To store the selected radio station press the MEMORY button on the remote F01 will flash display along with the frequency tuned.

Now press the PRESET -/+ (Prev/Next) button on the remote to select which Press memory number to store this station(1-30).

Press the Memory button to store this station.

To store additional stations repeat above steps 5-7.Press the Preset -/+ (Prev or Next) button repeatedly until the Preset station number is shown in the display.



Note 1: To change a station Preset memory simply retune to the desired station and memories that station into the desired Preset number, The new station will now be stored in that memory location.

Note 2: Tuning is cyclic, When the end of the frequency is reached the frequency shown in the display will be stationary. Press the opposite tuning search button Tuning -/+ and tune back back through band

Care and Maintenance

Handling Discs



To remove a disc from its storage case, press down on the centre of the case and lift the disc out.



Hold the disc by the edges, to avoid touching the recorded side of the disc.



Fingerprints and dust should be carefully wiped from the disc's surface with a soft cloth. Audio discs and DVD discs have no grooves to collect dust and microscopic debris so gently wiping with a soft cloth should remove most particles. Wipe in a straight line from the inside to the outside of the disc. Small dust particles and light stains should have no effect on reproduction quality.

Never use chemicals such as record sprays, antistatic sprays, benzine, or thinners to clean the discs. These chemicals can irreparably damage the disc's surface.

Discs should be returned to their cases after use. This avoids serious scratches that could cause the laser pickup to skip.

Power Source

This appliance must only be connected to a 230V AC, 50Hz mains supply.

- No connection must be made to the earth terminal inside the plug.

This symbol indicates that this appliance is Class II Double insulated. An earth connection is not required.
