
# **Goodmans**



GCR1875IP CLOCK RADIO WITH IPOD DOCKING It is important to read this instruction prior to using your new product for the first time To achieve the utmost in enjoyment and performance, please read this manual carefully before attempting to operate the unit in order to familiarise yourself with its features, and assure you years of faithful, trouble free performance and listening pleasure.

#### **Important Notes**

This safety and operating instruction manual should be retained for future reference. Avoid installing the unit in locations described below:

- -Places exposed to direct sunlight or close to heat radiating appliances such as electric heaters.
- -On top of other stereo equipment that radiate too much heat.
- -Places locking ventilation or dusty places.
- -Places subject to constant vibration.
- -Humid or moist places.
- -Make sure not to obstruct the ventilation openings. Operate tuning controls and switches as instructed in the manual.
- -Before turning on the power for the first time, make sure the power cord is properly installed.

For safety reasons, do not remove any covers or attempt to gain access to the inside of the product. Refer any servicing to qualified personnel.

Do not attempt to remove any screws, or open the casing of the unit; there are no user serviceable parts inside, refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.





### General controls




Top view




To turn off the wake function momentarily, to turn off the sleep function

### Clock

### Setting clock

set the clock manually as below:

- Press SET on the top of the unit until the clock setting icon ⊕ flashes on the display.
- 2. Rotate the knob on the top of the unit to set the clock time. The time decrements or increments follows by a faster rate when you rotate and hold the knob. The clock setting icon ⊙ flashes when you are setting the time. AM or PM icon also shows beside the time.
- To save and exit the clock setting, wait for about 5 seconds or press SET until the clock setting ⊙, WAKE 1 or WAKE 2 icon is off. The clock time is now set.

Daylight saving time
Press and hold DAYLIGHT
SAVING TIME button on the
bottom of the unit to turn on/ off
in areas observing/ not observing
such time change. The icon shows on the display when
daylight saving time is active.

WARNING: Avoid playing with this button when setting clock or wake time.

### Before you begin

Plugging in for power Insert the connector of the AC/DC adaptor to the power jack at the bottom of the unit. External AC/DC adaptor input power supply: 100-240V ~ 50/60Hz 0.7A

Power is fed to the unit even when it is not functioning. To cut the power supply off, the power cable must be unplugged.

#### Battery back-up operation

This clock radio is equipped with a memory back up system that can be powered with 2 "AA" batteries (batteries not included). The power failure protection circuit will not operate unless batteries are installed. When normal household power is interrupted, or AC power is unplugged, the batteries will power the clock radio to keep track of time and alarm settings programmed into memory. When the battery backup functions, the digital display will not light, however, the function of alarm will still work during the power interruption if remaining battery power is adequate. Normal

operation will resume after AC power is restored so you will not have to reset the time or the alarm.

Install battery as follow:

- Remove battery compartment door (located at the bottom of the radio) by applying thumb pressure to the tab on battery door and then lift the door out and off the cabinet.
- Insert 2 AA batteries (batteries not included).
- 3. Replace the compartment door.

Note: we recommend that you replace the batteries every year.

#### Power failure indicator

When external DC power is interrupted (disconnected) for a short period of time, both time and alarm settings will change (unless batteries are installed). After external DC power is restored (reconnected), the Digital Display will blink to indicate that power was interrupted and you should readjust the time and alarm settings.

#### Radio

#### Listening to the radio

- 1. Fully unwind the FM wire aerial
- 2. PressRADIO on the front of the unit to turn on the radio.
- Slide BAND to select the radio band. The selected radio band shows on the display.
- Rotate TUNING to select frequency. The selected frequency shows on the display.
- 5. PressOFF to turn off the radio. Built-in AFC

The Built-in Automatic Frequency Control (AFC) works only on FM. It helps reducing drift on FM reception and keeping the radio locked in on the FM station to which it is tuned. When tuning in FM stations, you may notice that the station you are tuning can be well-tuned on two or three nearby points on the dial. Always tune carefully at the loudest and clearest point.

AM Antenna
A built-in ferrite rod antenna
eliminates the need for an outside
antenna for AM reception.
Rotating the unit slightly may
improve reception of distant AM
stations.

### Display brightness

PressBRIGHTNESS to dim the display and press again to restore to the original brightness level. When the display is dimmed, the blue indicator on the universal dock for iPod will also be turned off.

#### Connecting your iPod

- Push the universal dock for iPod on the front of the unit to open it.
   Eight adapters are supplied.
- Check the table on the right and use the appropriate adapter for your iPod.

# Wake Function

# Turn off the wake function

· Silence the wake function

momentarily:
Press SNOOZE. The alarm will sound again when the snooze period is over.

#### OR

 Stop the wake function: PressOFF. The alarm will be on again the following day at the same time.

#### <u>OR</u>

 Disable the wake function permanently: PressWAKE 1 or WAKE 2 repeatedly until no corresponding wake indicator (e.g. ) shows on the display.

## Sleep Function

In the sleep mode, the radio, iPod or AUX mode turns off automatically. To set the sleep time, simply:

1. PressSLEEP repeatedly to cycle

- PressSLEEP repeatedly to cycle though the sleep time available (90min, 60min, 30min, 15min and OFF. 90min is the default setting).
   If necessary, press <</li>
- further set the sleep time. Each press of the button will decrease or increase one minute. For example, to set 35 min, press SLEEP to select 30min and then press >> 5 times.
- The icon flashes while selecting.
- 2. When the desired sleep time is selected, release SLEEP and wait for about 5 seconds, the sleep time is now set. The radio (default) turns on and the icon Tellights on the

    If the iPod is selected in your last sleep function setting, the iPod will start to play, instead of the radio. The radio will be played whenever the iPod

mode is selected but without the corresponding device connected.

- If an auxiliary player (e.g. mp3 player) is connected, press

 Press SLEEP once to check the remaining sleep time. Press SLEEP repeatedly to select

another sleep time.
 If you decide to turn off the unit sooner, press SNOOZE,

OFF or press SLEEP repeatedly

to select "OFF".When the sleep mode is activated again, the sleep time will be the same as the one

you have set before.

### **NAP Function**

disturbing the regular alarm settings, the NAP function wakes you up after a short period of time. Simply:

1. Press NAP repeatedly to cycle among the NAP time available

- Press NAP repeatedly to cycle among the NAP time available (10min, 20min, 30min, 60min, 90min, 120min and OFF. 20min is the default setting).
- If necessary, press ( /> ) to further set the NAP time. Each press of the button will decrease or increase one minute. For example, to set 35min, press NAP to select 30

min and then press >> 5 times.

- The icon NAP flashes while selecting.
- 2. When the desired NAP time is selected, release NAP and wait for about 5 seconds, the NAP time is now set. The current time shows and the icon NAP
- lights on the display.
  3. PressNAP once to show briefly
- the NAP time left.

  - selected in the NAP mode.
    PressOFF to stop the NAP alarm,
    OR press and hold NAP until "OFF"
    is selected to cancel NAP function.

### Wake Function

#### Set the wake time

This unit allows 2 wake times to be set.

- PressSET on the top of the unit until the icon WAKE1 or WAKE2 flashes on the display.

- To check the wake time after setting, press SET until the icon WAKE1 or WAKE2 flashes and the respective assigned wake time shows on the display.

### Waking to Alarm ( Note:

- The unit equips with GRAD-U-WAKE feature, the alarm tone volume will increase gradually to its maximum in about 30 to 45 seconds.
- If you set the wake function with low volume level before going to bed, we advise using Waking to Alarm mode to wake you up since the volume will automatically increase.
- When the AC power is disconnected, all wake mode will be reverted to alarm tone.

#### Waking to RADIO (□)

- Select a desired wake up radio channel (refer to "Listening to the radio"). If no wake up channel is set, your last listening radio statio n will be selected
- Adjust the volume to your desired level
- 5. PressOFF to turn off the unit.

#### Waking to iPod (♂)

- Adjust the volume to your desired level. The last played file on the iPod will be played when the wake function activates
- 4. PressOFF to turn off the unit.

Note: If there is no iPod connected, the alarm tone will sound instead even if Waking to iPod mode is selected. When the wake function activates, the corresponding wake icon will flash until the wake function is turned off. The icon will then stop flashing and stay lit.

#### Snooze

This operation allows extra sleep time after the wake function is on. The alarm will be off by pressing SNOOZE, SLEEPor NAP until the snooze period is over. Snooze function can be used repeatedly up to 2 hours. After this, the wake function will turn off until the next day.

Set the "quiet" period as follow: While pressing SNOOZE, rotate the knob on the top of the unit to set the "quiet" period from 1 to 30 minutes (default: 9 minutes). Release SNOOZE, then the "quiet" period is set.
