You may already be familiar with using a DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player but do please take time to read these instructions. They are designed to familiarise you with the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player's many new features and to ensure you get the very best out of your new purchase.

Your safety and the safety of others is important. Please, therefore, ensure you read the Safety Instructions on Page 41 **before** you operate this DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player.

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# Getting started

Remove vour DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player carefully from the box. You may wish to store the packaging for future use.

### In the box

#### Read these instructions before use.

Unless stated otherwise, all references to buttons refer to the remote control.

# Switching on

#### Mains power

Connect the 3-pin mains plug into the mains socket and switch on

#### **Please Note**

When not in use, disconnect the mains plug from the power socket.

The DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player will go to standby mode with the LCD displaying --:--.

#### Standby



When the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player is in standby mode, you can press the Standby button on the remote control to turn it on. The display will show ON.



Alternatively, press the **Standby**/ On button or Select button on the front of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3

Player. Either the DVD or VHS LED will illuminate and the LCD will show ON.

The DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player will switch to Standby after 5 minutes with no tape or disc loaded.

Do not leave the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player on standby when unattended or overnight.

# Switching off



STANDBY/ON Press the **Standby/On** button on the front of the DVD/VCR/CD/ MP3 Player or the **Standby** button on the remote control. Unplug from the mains supply. The display will show OFF.

# Using the remote control

#### Installing the batteries

Remove the battery cover. Insert two (AA) size batteries in the compartment. Refer to the diagram in the battery compartment for correct installation of the batteries.

We recommend the use of Ever Ready Energizer Batteries.



To use the remote control, point it at the front of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player. The sensor is to the left of the display window

The remote control will work up to 7 metres from the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player and at an angle of up to 60 degrees.

Do not block the path of the beam from the remote to the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player. Dark walls, direct sunlight or very bright light will reduce the remote control sensitivity.

# **General features**

# Child lock

When child lock is on, none of the buttons on the front of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player will operate.



Press the **Standby** button on the remote control until the LCD shows LOCK (about five seconds).

To release the child lock, press any button on the remote control.

### Switching the On Screen Display (OSD) On or Off



Press the **VCR** button on the remote control to change to VHS mode.

Press the **Setup/enter** button to enter the Setup menu.

Select VCR SETUP, press the **Return/OK** button and then OSD ON/OFF using the **Arrow** buttons.

To turn the OSD off, select OFF using the **Arrow** buttons and press the **Return/OK** button.

### Setting up your DVD/ VCR/CD/MP3 Player to receive TV stations

#### Important

Before you start, unplug all equipment from the mains supply.

Connect your aerial to the ANT IN socket on the rear of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player.

You can either connect the DVD/VCR/CD/ MP3 Player to the TV with an RF lead or a Scart lead.

Plug the RF lead into the ANT OUT socket on the rear of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player and into the aerial lead of the TV.

or

Plug the Scart lead into the Scart socket on the rear of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player and into the Scart socket on the TV.

To connect a satellite system through an RF lead, consult the satellite system user guide and connect the aerial to the RF in socket on the rear of the satellite decoder.

Connect an RF lead from the RF out socket on the decoder to the ANT IN socket on the rear of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player.

Plug the RF lead into the ANT OUT socket on the rear of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player and into the aerial lead of the TV.



Press the **Return/OK** button on the remote control until the LCD shows RF 52 (about 5 seconds). The DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player is now transmitting its test signal on channel 52. To turn the test signal off, press the **Return/OK** button again for more than five seconds.

Consult your TV user guide for instructions of how to tune the TV to the DVD/VCR/CD/ MP3 Player.

When tuning your TV, the following OSD will be shown:



To connect a satellite system using Scart leads, connect the Scart out socket of the decoder to the EUROAV2/DECODER Scart socket on the rear of the DVD/VCR/CD/ MP3 Player. Connect the EUROAV1 Scart socket to the TV Scart socket.

Consult your TV user guide for instructions of how to tune the TV to the DVD/VCR/CD/ MP3 Player.

#### Autoset

The first time you switch the DVD/VCR/ CD/MP3 Player on, the TV should show AUTO SET.





Press the **Return/OK** button to start AUTO SET.

If this does not appear, press the **Setup/enter** button, select PR PRESET with the **Down arrow** button and press the **Return/OK** button. A new screen will appear with AUTO SET highlighted, press the **Return/OK** button again to start AUTO SET.

### CH 25

PLEASE WAIT ...

#### SETUP : END

AUTO SET tunes in all the available stations and then puts them into the most common order i.e. BBC1, BBC2, ITV1, CH4, CH5, SKY 1 etc. If, during Autoset, a station is found that is on the same channel as the RF output channel of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player, the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player will recommend a new channel for RF output.

To accept this change, press the **Return/OK** button.

IMPORTANT! PLEASE CHANGE THE TV CH TO 54.

You will then have to retune your TV.

Set the program number with the **Left** or **Right arrow** button.

#### Reception



Select the broadcast system, Aerial (CH) or Cable(CC) with the **Left** or **Right arrow** button.

#### Autosearch



If you know the channel number, you can enter it directly using the **Numeric** buttons or search using the **Right arrow** button. When you press the **Right arrow** button, the autosearch will search for the next station. When it finds one, it will be displayed. If it is the one you require stop searching, if not, continue the search.

#### Fine tuning

In some areas where reception is poor, it may be necessary to adjust the fine tuning to get the best picture or sound.



In the MANUAL SET menu, select FINE TUNING and press the **Return/OK** button.

Use the **Left** or **Right arrow** button to adjust the fine tuning to get the best picture or sound.

#### Decoder



If you have a decoder connected to the EUROAV2/DECODER socket, press the **Left** or **Right arrow** button to select On or Off.

#### Name



You can change or create a name for the program you have selected. Press the **0** button to change the name. Press the **1** button to create a new name. Use the **Up** or **down arrow** button to change the letters and the **Left** or **Right arrow** button to move to the next letter.



When you have finished tuning, press the **Return/OK** button to store the station. You will be returned to the program list menu ready to start tuning the next program.



You can exit the Setup menu at any time by pressing the **Setup/enter** button.

#### Sorting program locations

You can change the order of the programs to suit your yourself.



Press the **Setup/enter** button to enter the Setup menu.



In the SETUP menu, select PR PRESET and press the **Return/OK** button. In the PR PRESET menu, select PR ALIGN and press the **Return/OK** button.

Select the program you require to move and press the **Return/OK** button. Use the **Up** or **down arrow** button to move the program to its new location. Press the **Return/OK** button.

#### **Deleting programs**



In the Setup menu, select PR PRESET and press the **Return/OK** button. In the PR PRESET menu, select PR ERASE and press the **Return/OK** button.

# Using the VCR



To select the VCR, press the VCR button on the remote control or the **Select** button on the front of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player. The VHS LED will illuminate.

# Playback

Insert a video cassette into the video slot. 00 will appear on the left of the LCD.

#### Please Note

Allow the VCR to automatically load the video cassette. If you try and push the video cassette into the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player you may damage the video cassette or the VCR.



To eject the video cassette, press the VCR eject button on the front of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player.

Press the **Play/pause** button.

VCR will appear above the  $\overline{OO}$  symbol, which will appear to start turning and PLAY will appear briefly in the middle of the LCD.

The OSD will show PLAY SP or LP (short play or long play) and the sound output i.e. HI FI L & R.

#### Please Note

Some pre-recorded cassettes may start to play automatically when they are loaded. The LCD and OSD displays will be the same as above.

#### Pausing playback



PLAY/PAUSE Press the **Play/pause** button to pause the playback.



The LCD will show STILL.



Press the **Play/pause** button again to resume normal playback.

#### Stopping playback



Press the **Stop** button.

The LCD will show STOP and VCR will disappear from above the  $\overline{00}$ symbol which will stop turning.

#### Fast skip forward/reverse



During playback, press the **Skip** forward button to fast forward through the cassette. The LCD will show CUE 1.



Press the **Skip forward** button again to increase the speed of the search. The LCD will show CUE 2.

PLAY/PAUSE To resume normal playback, press the **Play/pause** button.



Press the **Skip reverse** button to go fast backwards through the cassette. The LCD will show REV 1.



Press the **Skip reverse** button again to increase the speed of the search. The LCD will show REV 2.



To resume normal playback, press the **Play/pause** button.

#### Slow skip forward/reverse



Press the **Play/pause** button to pause playback.



Press the **Skip forward** button.

The cassette will advance very slowly and the LCD will show SLOW.

#### Frame advance



PLAY/PAUSE Press the Play/pause button to pause playback.

NFXT ► PLAY/PAUSE

Press the **Next** button. Each time you press the button, the tape will advance by one frame. To resume normal playback, press the **Play/pause** button.

#### Tracking

The VCR is fitted with an automatic tracking system, however manual tracking adjustment is provided.

The manual tracking should only be used if:

- The picture is poor in playback.
- There is noise at the top or bottom of the screen in slow search.
- The paused picture is unstable.



To adjust the tracking, use the VCR **tracking +/-** buttons until the picture is watchable.

#### **Rewind/Fast forward**



To rewind a video cassette, press the Skip reverse button whilst the VCR is in the stop mode.

To fast forward through a video cassette, press the **Skip forward** button whilst the VCR is in the stop mode.

To stop Rewind or Fast forward, press the **Stop** button.

The rewind/fast forward will stop automatically when the end of the tape is reached.

#### Recording **Copyright Notice Warning**

- CHANNEL+

To select the VCR, press the VCR button on the remote control or the Select button on the front of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player. The VHS LED will illuminate.

Switch on the TV and select the video channel using the **Channel** up or Channel down button on the front of the DVD/VCR/CD/ MP3 Player.

Insert a blank, recordable video cassette into the VCR.

If you are recording a program from the TV, select the channel on the VCR. Confirm the program is showing on the TV.



If you are recording from an external input, press the **Output** button until the external input appears on the TV screen.



Select the recording speed (LP - long play or SP - short play) with the Speed record/angle button.



Press the **Record** button on the front of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player to start recording. The LCD will show REC and the program you are recording.

O will appear next to the  $\overline{OO}$ .

The LCD will show REC, the recording speed and the program being recorded.



If you want to pause the recording, press the **Play/pause** button. If you leave the recording paused for more than five minutes, the recording is switched off automatically.





Whilst you are recording, you can watch a DVD. Press the **DVD** button on the remote control or the **Select** button on the front of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player so that the DVD LED is illuminated.



You can watch another TV channel whilst recording. Press the **TV/VCR** button to view another channel.

# Recording from DVD to Video cassette



TV/VCR

Select the DVD with the **DVD** button.

Insert a DVD into the DVD tray and insert a blank, recordable video cassette into the VCR.



Press the **Quick copy** button on the front of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player or press the **Play/pause** button. Press the **VCR** button and press the **Record** button on the front of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player. The DVD will start to play and the VCR will start to record.

#### **Please Note**

Some DVDs have a copy prevention system. If this is the case the OSD will show:

#### NO COPY DISK PLEASE CONFIRM THE DISK

and the recording will stop.



To stop the recording, press the **VCR** button and then press the **Stop** button.

#### One touch recording

If you want to record from the TV but do not have time to set up the timer, you can use the one touch recording.

> Follow the instructions under Recording on Page 15 but do not press the record button.

- •REC Press the **Record** button on the front of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player once to start the recording and then press it again. The LCD will show REC 0:30. The VCR will record for 30 minutes and then switch off.
- •REC Every subsequent press of the **Record** button will increase the recording time by 30 minutes up to a maximum of 10 hours.

The LCD will continue to show the recording time as it counts down.

To stop recording, press the **Stop** button until the LCD shows STOP (about five seconds).

#### Recording using the timer

You have two methods of timer recordings, VideoPlus and normal.

#### Please Note

The clock and date must be correct and the stations tuned before attempting to set the timer.

#### Normal timer recording

Press the **Setup/enter** button to enter the Setup menu.

Highlight Timer program and press the **Return/OK** button twice.

Enter the Program number, start time for the recording, end time for the recording, date of the recording (if not today), whether you require Short Play or Long Play. Switch VPS/PDC off as you are manually setting the timer.



Check your settings. If you wish to make any changes use the **Left** or **Right arrow** button. When you are happy with your setting, press the **Return/OK** button.

The OSD will then tell you to insert a video cassette and turn off your VCR. The LCD will show  $\rfloor$  next to the  $\sigma \sigma$ .

#### Please Note

If program timings overlap, the VCR will give a warning message. If you do not adjust the times, the VCR will record the first program completely and then continue with the second one.

If there is insufficient free space for the recording on the video cassette, the VCR will switch to LP to increase the recording capacity.

The VCR will eject a video cassette if the safety tab has been removed.

#### Timer review - changing and erasing



Press the **Setup/enter** button to enter the Setup menu.



Highlight Timer program and press the Return/OK button once.

If you require to make changes, move to the position with the Left or **Right arrow** button. Change the settings using the **Up** or **Down** arrow button and the Numeric buttons. When the settings are



correct, press the Left or Right arrow button until OK CONFIRM appears on the bottom line. Press the Return/OK button to confirm and the **Setup/enter** button to exit the menu.

#### Copying



To copy to your VCR from another VCR, connect both machines with a cable between their Scart sockets. Select AV1 or AV2 using the Output button or the **Up** or **Down arrow** button.

Set the other VCR to playback and yours to record.

OUTPUT To copy from your VCR to another VCR, connect both machines with a cable between their Scart sockets. Select AV1 using the **Output** button or the **Up** or **Down arrow** button.

#### **Please Note**

You cannot use AV2 for this purpose as it is an input only socket.

Set the other VCR to record and yours to playback.



To copy from equipment such as a camcorder, you can use the RCA sockets on the front of the DVD/ VCR/CD/MP3 Player. Press the **Output** button to select AV-F and record as previously described.

#### VCR functions Clock/counter display



CLK/CNT Press the Clock/counter button, the counter counts in real time from the point the tape is at when you load the video cassette. The counter does not count unrecorded parts of the tape. Pressing the Clock/ counter button again, reverts the LCD to the current time.

> If you rewind beyond the zero position, the counter will show a negative value.

DISPLAY Press the **Display** button once to show, initially, the Time and date and the current status at the bottom of the screen. After a few seconds the status will disappear.

DISPLAY Press the **Display** button twice to show, initially, the counter and the current status at the bottom of the screen. After a few seconds the status will disappear.

DISPLAY

Press the **Display** button three times to turn the display off.

#### Remaining time and Video cassette length

This tells you how much time remains on a video cassette so that you will know, for example, if there is sufficient space for a recording.



Press the Setup/enter button to enter the Setup menu.

Select Tape control and press the Return/OK button.

#### Wide screen format Playback/ recording

You can record or play programs in 16:9 format.



Press the **Setup/enter** button to enter the Setup menu.



Select VCR SETUP and press the **Return/OK** button.



Select 16:9 and press the **Return/OK** button.



#### Auto

The VCR automatically detects the program format (16:9 or 4:3) and records or plays this program in the same format.

#### On

The VCR will play and record all programs in 16:9 format.

#### Off

The VCR will play and record all programs in 4:3 format.

#### Please Note

To watch a program which is recorded in 16:9 format by the VCR, your TV must have 16:9 wide screen function and you have to use a Scart lead. For the above formats to work, your TV must be able to automatically detect a 16:9 program. If you turn the 16:9 format off, your TV may override this setting and display the picture in 16:9 format.

#### Auto clock

Some broadcasting stations transmit the time and date along with the signal. The DVD/ VCR/CD/MP3 Player will automatically use this time and date during the initial setting up procedure, during normal use and every time you switch the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player off at the mains. If you find that this time and date is incorrect, you can turn this feature off and set the time manually.



Press the **Setup/enter** button to enter the Setup menu. Select VCR SETUP and press the **Return/OK** button.

Enter the time and date using the **Numeric** buttons. If you enter a single digit number, wait a few seconds for the DVD/VCR/CD/ MP3 Player to enter the number properly. To store the time and date, press the **Return/OK** button. Press the **Setup/enter** button to exit the menu.

#### VCR Audio

The VCR is equipped with a high quality Hi Fi sound system.

While the VCR is in stop mode the OSD displays the current program being broadcast. If you switch to another program, or the sound mode of the current program changes, the OSD will display the program details and sound mode (STEREO BIL I/ BIL II). If this is not visible, press the **Audio** button. If there is still no display of the sound mode this is because the sound is monaural.



AUDIO

During playback, the OSD will display the sound mode recorded on the video tape (Hi Fi ). If this is not visible, press the **Audio** button. If there is still no display of the sound mode this is because the sound is monaural.

AUDIO To change the Hi Fi output during playback, press the **Audio** button.

You can select from:

Hi Fi L + R Hi Fi LEFT Hi Fi RIGHT Hi Fi OFF



During a bilingual program playback, press the **Audio** button to select from:

Main language (original soundtrack). Sub language (dubbed sound track). Both main and sub languages. Bilingual off.

# Using the DVD

The DVD is compatible with PAL/NTSC DVD.

#### **Please Note**

When the symbol  $\boldsymbol{\oslash}$  appears in the top left hand corner of the screen display, this indicates that the operation being attempted can not be activated at this time.

### **DVD** playback

With no disc in place and the DVD drawer closed, the DVD/VCR/CD/ MP3 Player LCD will display 'no disc' and the television on-screen display (OSD) will display No Disc.

OPEN/CLOSE Press the **Open/Close** button to open the DVD drawer.

> LCD will display OPEN and the OSD will display OPEN.

Place a disc, label side up onto the DVD drawer.



OPEN/CLOSE Press the Open/Close button to close the DVD drawer.

LCD will display CLOSE followed by LOAD and will then show the type of disc loaded. The OSD will display Close followed by Loading and will indicate the type of disc loaded.

In the case of DVDs, the DVD will pause at the disc start menus to enable you to make appropriate playback selections. MENU may be shown on the LCD.

With DVDs, the LCD will show the Chapter and elapsed time.

With VCDs and CDs the LCD will show the Title and elapsed time.

With audio discs, the LCD will initially show the number of tracks and total play time for the disc. When playing, the LCD will show the track number and elapsed time.

### MP3 playback

Once the MP3 disc has been loaded, the OSD will display the disc type (MP3), the total number of tracks and the Album titles on the disc



PLAY/PAUSE

You can select the album you require to listen to with the **Up** or **Down** arrow button.

When you press the **Play/pause** button, the OSD will display the number of the track being played, total number of tracks, elapsed play time and the names of the tracks on the album.

#### Pausina playback

PLAY/PAUSE Press the **Play/pause** button to pause the playback.

> The LCD will display PAUSE. The OSD will display I Pause briefly.



Press the Play/pause button to resume normal playback.

The LCD will display PLAY. The OSD will display ► Play briefly.

#### Stopping playback



Press the **Stop** button. The DVD stops playing.

The LCD will display STOP.

The OSD will display ■ Resume Stop briefly.

The DVD remembers the place on the disc where it stopped playing.

When switched on, returns all settings to the manufacturer's original set up.

#### Video menu TV aspect

The aspect ratio of the picture provided by the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player can be varied in line with the features available on the TV in use.

The options available are:

#### 16x9 Wide screen

Choose this setting if your DVD/VCR/CD/ MP3 Player is connected to a widescreen TV.

#### Please Note

Depending on the format of the DVD disc, e.g. 2.35:1 the picture may still have black lines above and below the picture.



#### 4x3 Letterbox

Allows you to see movies in their original aspect ratio. You will see the entire frame of the movie, but it will occupy a smaller portion of the screen.



#### 4x3 Pan & Scan

Fills the centre of your TV screen leaving a black border at the right and left edges.



#### TV type

The video standard of the DVD/VCR/CD/ MP3 Player output can be selected from NTSC or PAL.



Pressing the **System** button will provide an OSD of which TV type is in use.

If PAL is selected, the video output will be converted to PAL standard irrespective of disc standard.

If NTSC is selected, the video output will be converted to NTSC standard irrespective of disc standard.

#### Video out

You can select between RGB and S-Video. S-Video separates the colour and luminance signals before transmitting them to the TV to achieve a sharper picture.

#### Please Note

Your TV must have a S-Video input to use the S-Video output.

#### Brightness

You can select normal or bright.

#### Sharpness

You can select normal, soft or sharp.

#### Audio menu Digital out

#### Bitstream:

When this mode is selected, the digital audio contained in the disc is passed to the amplifier without being decoded.

#### PCM:

When this mode is selected, the digital audio contained in the disc is DECODED by the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player and passed to the amplifier through the digital output in PCM format.

OFF: No digital output.

#### Dual mono

Dual mono consists of 2 mono channels. You can select:

#### STEREO:

Left channel to left speaker. Right channel to right speaker.

#### L-MONO: Left channel to both speakers.

R-MONO: Right channel to both speakers.

#### MIXED MONO:

A mixture of both channels to both speakers.

#### Dynamic range

When watching a DVD, if some of the loud sounds are too loud and yet some of the quieter sounds cannot be heard, you can increase the dynamic range. Start with 1/4 and work up to full. When you can hear all the sound without having to alter the volume, the dynamic range is correct.



#### Please Note

If an active digital audio output signal is supplied to a receiver or other equipment without a corresponding digital decoding capability, a very loud noise may be produced which could permanently damage the loudspeakers.

#### Other menu



#### OSD

You can turn the OSD (On Screen Display) On or Off.

#### Angle mark

If you are playing a disc with multi angle scenes, select Angle Mark and the angle mark symbol **\*** will be displayed when angled scenes are available.

#### Screen saver

With the screen saver on, the screen saver will appear if the DVD is left in Resume Stop, Stop or Open mode for more than 5 minutes.

#### Defaults

Resets all settings, except parental lock, to factory settings.

#### Parental

Not all DVDs have this facility.



Parental contains eight levels of parental control, from Adult where any DVD can be viewed to Kids Safe where only DVDs suitable for small children can be viewed.

# Help and advice

# DVD

#### The picture quality is poor

Ensure that the DVD disc is in the drawer with the label uppermost. Make sure the DVD disc surface is not damaged.

Clean the DVD disc and try again. The DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player may be affected by a damp DVD disc or condensation. Wait for 1 to 2 hours in Standby to dry the equipment.

#### Disc does not play

No disc in the machine. Disc incorrectly loaded. Wrong type of disc. The DVD/VCR/CD/ MP3 Player cannot play CD-ROMS etc.

#### Wrong OSD language

Select the language in the Setup menu.

# The language for the sound or subtitles on a DVD cannot be changed

Multilingual sound and subtitles not recorded on the DVD.

# Some functions (Angle, Zoom etc.) do not work

These functions are not be available on the DVD.

Angle can only be changed when the angle symbol is displayed.

#### No picture

Check the scart lead is connected properly and that all connections between the DVD/ VCR/CD/MP3 Player and other attached equipment are secure.

Have you pressed the correct buttons on the remote control? Try once more.

#### No sound

Check the volume is set to an audible level. Make sure you have not switched the sound off accidentally.

#### **Distorted sound**

If the sound output suffers from poor stereo separation, missing channels/spoken dialogue or general distortion, check the speaker setup menu. Ensure that only those channels in use are selected. Check also that the appropriate listening mode setting is correct.

# VCR

#### Cannot load a video cassette

There is already a video cassette in the VCR. The video cassette is the wrong way round.

#### A video cassette will not eject

If the video cassette has been in the VCR cassette a long time, it may have stretched the tape. Unplug the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player, wait 10 minutes and try again.

# Noise (screen noise) appears on the screen

Tracking may need adjustment. Worn video cassette. Dirty VCR heads.

#### Cannot record

Safety tab missing from video cassette.

### General

#### No response from remote control

Make sure the remote control is in the correct mode. Check batteries are fitted correctly.

#### If nothing works

If you have tried the above solutions and none seem to work, try switching your DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player off and on again.

If this does not work, contact your supplier or qualified repair technician. Never attempt to repair a defective DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player yourself.

# Care and maintenance

### Handling discs

Hold the disc by the edges so that you do not get fingermarks on the playing surfaces. Fingerprints dirt and scratches can cause skipping and distortion.

Do not write on the non-label areas with any writing utensil.

Do not try to install more than one disc on the disc tray.

Do not expose discs to direct sunlight, high humidity or high temperatures for long periods.

Make sure you store the disc in its case when not in use.

# **Cleaning discs**

Use a soft cloth to wipe off any fingerprints or dust from the disc surface. Wipe in a straight line from the centre to the outside of the disc. Small dust particles and light stains will not affect reproduction quality.

Never use chemicals such as record sprays, antistatic sprays, benzene or thinners to clean your disc.

# **Cleaning VCR heads**

Insert a head cleaner in the VCR. Press play for 5 seconds and then fast forward for ten seconds. Eject the head cleaner. If the heads are still dirty, repeat the cleaning 2 or 3 times.

# VCR condensation

If the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player is brought into a warm room from the cold outside, condensation will form on the heads. If you try and use the VCR, damage may occur to the heads or the cassette.

Turn the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player on and allow it to stand for about 2 hours before playing a video cassette.

### **Record safety tab**

At the rear of a blank video tape is a safety tab. If this tab is removed you cannot record on the video cassette.

This is a safety feature to prevent pre recorded video cassettes being recorded over.

# Safety instructions

Read all the safety instructions before first use of your DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player.

#### **Power source**

You should only plug the DVD/VCR/CD/ MP3 Player into a 230V to 240VAC, 50Hz supply.

#### Safety considerations

- Position the power supply lead and other leads so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by things placed on or against them.
- Do not use the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player in humid or damp conditions. Do not allow the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player to get wet, i.e. dripping or splashing, as this may be dangerous. Do not place water filled objects, such as vases, on top of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player.
- Make sure that no naked flame sources, such as candles, are placed on top of the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player.

#### Cleaning

- Unplug the DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player before you clean it.
- Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners.
- Clean your DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player with a soft, damp (not wet) cloth.

#### Ventilation

- Any slots and openings on the DVD/VCR/ CD/MP3 Player are for ventilation. Do not cover or block them as it could lead to overheating.
- NEVER let children push anything into the holes or slots on the case.

#### Servicing

- There are no user serviceable parts in your DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player.
- When servicing, refer to qualified service personnel.
- Consult your dealer if you are ever in doubt about the installation, operation or safety of your DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player.

#### **Battery disposal**

Please ensure batteries are disposed of safely.

#### **Electrical information**

Make sure that the voltage of your electricity supply is the same as that indicated on the rating plate. This DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player may be fitted with a non-rewireable plug. If you need to change the fuse in a nonrewireable plug, the fuse cover must be refitted. If the fuse cover is lost or damaged, the plug must not be used until a replacement is obtained (available from the DVD/VCR/ CD/MP3 Player manufacturer). It is important that the colour of the replacement fuse cover corresponds with the colour marking on the base of the plug. If the plug has to be changed because it is not suitable for your socket, or becomes damaged, it should be removed and an appropriate plug fitted following the wiring instructions below. The plug removed must be disposed of safely as insertion into a mains socket is likely to cause an electrical hazard.

If a 5 Amp (BS1363) plug is used, a 5 Amp fuse (BS1362) must be fitted, or if any other type of plug is used a 5 Amp fuse must be fitted, either in the plug, adaptor or on the distribution board.

As the colours of the wires in the mains lead of this DVD/VCR/CD/MP3 Player may not correspond with the coloured markings identifying the terminals in your plug, proceed as follows:-

- No connection is to be made to the earth terminal of the plug.
