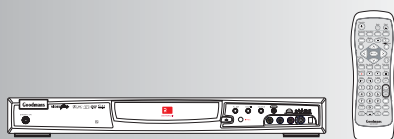

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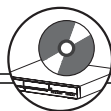
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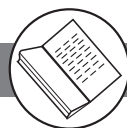
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Important Safeguards

For your own safety read following instructions carefully before attempting to connect this recorder to the mains.

Mains Supply: 230V ~ 50Hz - AC only

This unit is designed to operate on a **230V~50Hz** supply only. Connecting it to other power sources may damage it. Ensure that the supply corresponds to the information on the rating label at the rear of the recorder.

This component system may be fitted with a non-rewireable plug. If it is necessary to change the fuse in a non-rewireable plug the fuse cover must be refitted. If the fuse cover becomes lost or damaged, the plug must not be used until a replacement, available from the manufacturer, is obtained. It is important that the colour of the replacement fuse cover corresponds with the colour marking on the base of the plug.

If the plug needs to be changed because it is not suitable for your socket, or becomes damaged, it should be cut off and an appropriate plug fitted following the wiring instructions below. The plug must then be disposed of safely, as insertion into a 13A socket is likely to cause an electrical hazard.

IMPORTANT

The wires in the mains plug should be connected as shown in the diagram.

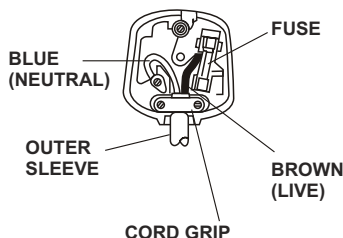
The colours of the wires in the mains lead of the unit may not correspond with the coloured markings identifying the terminals in your plug. Connect them as follows:-

The wire which is coloured blue must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter 'N' or coloured black.

The wire which is coloured brown must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter 'L' or coloured red.

There should be no connection to the earth terminal of your plug.

If a 13 Amp (BS 1363) Plug is used, a 3 Amp Fuse must be fitted, or if any other type of Plug is used a 3 Amp or 5 Amp Fuse must be fitted, either in the Plug or Adaptor, or on the Distribution Board.



This symbol means that this unit is double insulated. An earth connection is not required.

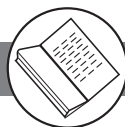

Precautions

Please read these precautions before operating this unit.

■ Power cord protection

To avoid any malfunctions of the unit, and to protect against electric shock, fire or personal injury, please observe the following.

- Hold the plug firmly when connecting or disconnecting the AC power cord.
- Keep the AC power cord away from heating appliances.
- Never put any heavy object on the AC power cord.
- Do not attempt to repair or reconstruct the AC power cord in any way.

■ Placement

Avoid placing the unit in areas of:

- direct sunlight or heating radiators, or closed automobiles

3 Make the necessary connections.

Refer to the section of "**CONNECTIONS**" in the manual. It will guide you how to make the connections with external audio and video device.

4 Set the necessary settings from the initial setup menu.

Before you operate the DVD recorder, refer to the section of **Chapter 4:Initial Settings** in the manual. It will provide on-screen menus with different options to let you select the proper settings corresponding to the system.

5 Record a disc.

You can record your favourite shows from local cable TV, or music and picture from an external audio and video device on both DVD+R and DVD+RW media. Refer to section of **Chapter 1-2 Recording** in the manual.

6 Play back a disc.

After making all the connections and menu setups, you can start to play DVD, DVD+R, DVD+RW, DVD-R, DVD-RW, JPEG photo CD, Video CD, MP3, or CD discs with the recorder. Refer to section of **Chapter 2-1 : DVD Playback**, or **Chapter 3-1 : Audio CD Playback**.

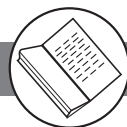

Note: Refer to the diagram inside the battery compartment for correct installation of batteries.



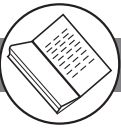
We recommend the use of Alkaline batteries.

To use the remote control, point it at the front of the DVD player, towards the sensor situated to the right of the DVD drawer.

The remote control has a range of up to 6 metres from the DVD player and at an angle of up to 60 degrees.

Do not block the path of the beam from the remote control to the DVD player.

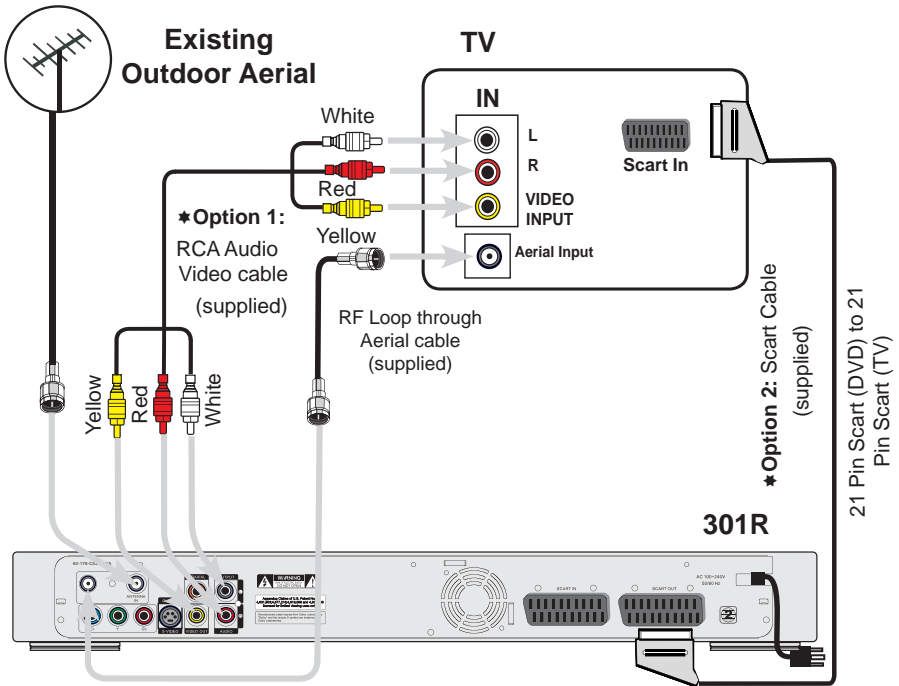
Note: Sunlight or very bright light will reduce the remote control sensitivity.

Making Your First Recording



DVD+R

When you first-time operate this recorder, please make the proper connection to TV and aerial (Refer to "Connecting External Equipment" section), then follow on-screen instruction to made the first initial setting. For more details about recording, refer to "**Chapter 1 : Recording Functions**". For more details on advanced initial setting, refer to "**Chapter 4 : Initial Setting**".

1 Turn on your TV.

2 Press ^{Standby} Standby/On button on this recorder and remote control.

An on-screen clock time and day setting dialog box appears on the screen.

3 Press / button to select "Time" and "Date", and press / button to change the variable.



Make sure the time and date match to your local time and date.

4 Press .

4a Your DVD Recorder will automatically start tuning in all the receivable channels to your TV. This process may take several minutes to be done.

4b A warning message appears when the aerial connection did not make properly.

5 Press ^{Eject} EJECT to open the disc tray.

6 Place a recordable DVD+RW or DVD+R onto the disc tray. Label side facing upwards.



This recorder is only compatible with DVD+R and DVD+RW for recording.

7 Press ^{Eject} EJECT again to close the disc tray.




Do not push the disc tray closed.

8 Follow the Onscreen instruction and select "YES" to format your disc.

9 Press ^{TV-DVDR} TV→DVDR on the remote control to switch to TV mode.

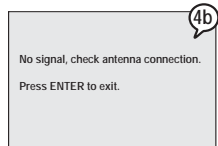
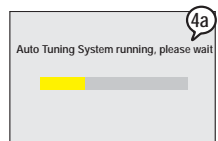
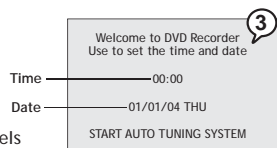
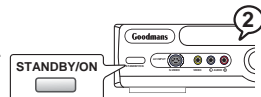
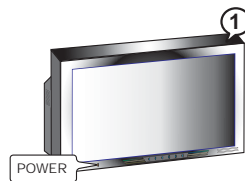
10 Press ^{Source} SOURCE on the remote control to toggle different external A/V input sources.



Press ^{Source}  SOURCE repeatedly to scroll through various A/V input, including: TV, Scart, CVBS1, CVBS2, S-Video1, and S-Video2.

11 Press ^{Rec/OTR} REC/OTR on the remote control to start to record.

12 Press ^{Stop} STOP on the remote control to stop recording.

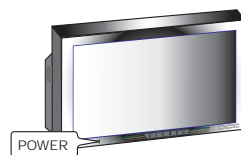


- 1 Press the **STANDBY/ON** button on the DVD recorder or the Power button on the remote control to turn on your DVD Recorder.**

The power LED is green on.

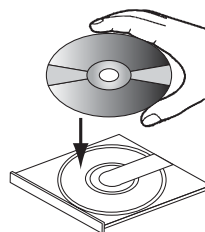


- 2 Turn on your TV, and switch it to the correct Video In channel.**



- 3 Press **EJECT** to open the disc tray. Place a disc onto the tray.**

Hold the disc without touching its surfaces, position it with the printed title side facing up, align it with the guides, and place it in its proper position.



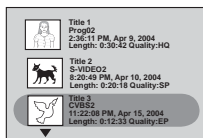
- 4 Press **EJECT** again to close the tray. The DVD Recorder starts playback.**

- 5 If it does not start playback, do the following:**

- If playing a DVD/DVD+R/DVD+RW, a disc menu appears. Press **◀/▶/▲/▼** to select the preferred title and press **▶/◀** to start playback.
- If playing an Audio or MP3 CD, Press **▶/◀** to start playback.

- 6 Press **+ Volume -** buttons on your TV to adjust the volume.**

- 7 To stop playback, press the **STOP** button.**

1-1 Before Recording



This chapter mainly show you how to record DVD discs from external sources using the remote control. Some of the functions can also be done by using OSD Settings shown on the TV. Please refer to **Chapter 4-2: RECORD/DISC Setup for details.**

- Before Timer recording, check the date and time setting again to make sure the information of the date and time is correct. Please refer to **Chapter 4-5 Timer Setup for more details.**
- Make sure this Recorder is connected to external equipment correctly. Please refer to **"Connecting External Equipment"** section for more details.
- This Recorder is only compatible with DVD+R or DVD+RW discs for recording.

POOR RECORDINGS: To prevent ruined recordings always check on the following:

1. Always purchase good quality / named branded discs's. Some cheap / unbranded discs may give rise to skipped / portions of the recordings to be missed.
2. It is essential that the discs are kept clean from finger prints and scratches. Always put the disc back into its holder when not in use.
3. A feature of this DVD recorder is that it will carry on recording over scratches / blemishes or badly made disc's. On play back of the recording this will show as parts of the recording being skipped. This is NOT A FAULT OF THE PLAYER but a disc problem. Replace the disc with a new one if this occurs.

Record Quality Setting

- 1 Press Rec. Quality button on the remote control. A Record Quality dialog box appears on the screen.**
- 2 Press Rec. Quality button repeatedly to cycle through the preferred record quality.**



- HQ (High Quality): to record about one hour
- SP (Standard Play): to record about two hours
- LP (Long Play): to record about three hours
- EP (Extended Play): to record about four hours
- SLP (Standard Long Play): to record about six hours



For details on how to do Record Quality OSD Setting, please refer to **Chapter 4-2: RECORD/DISC Setup.**

Disc Media Setting

Only works when a DVD+R or DVD+RW is loaded.

Erase/Format Setting

Erasing/formatting DVD discs can only be done through the OSD Setting. Please refer to **Chapter 4-2: RECORD/DISC Setup for details.**

Finalise Setting

- Before a non-ReWritable DVD disc can be played on another DVD player it has to be finalised. Re-Writable DVD discs do not have to be finalised to play on other DVD players.
- DVD Discs Finalization can only be done through the OSD Setting. Please refer to **Chapter 4-2: RECORD/DISC Setup for details.**



1-2 Recording

To Record TV Programs While watching

1 Turn on this DVD Recorder and your TV.

2 Press EJECT to open the disc tray.

3 Place a recordable DVD+RW or DVD+R onto the disc tray.
Hold the disc without touching its surface, position it with the printed title facing up, align it with the guides, and place it in its proper position.

4 Press EJECT again to close the disc tray.

- If the disc is empty and has no record contents, "100% free" will show on the TV.
- If you use an unused DVD+RW or DVD+R, the first reading will take about one minute.

5 Press TV→DVDR on the remote control to switch to TV mode.

You will see the "LIVE" appears on the screen following by the TV programme.

6 Press PR +/- or the Number buttons to select the TV channel you wish to record.

7 Press RECORD/OTR on the remote to start recording.

"REC" will appear on the right corner of the TV screen.

One Touch Recording (OTR) Function:

You can set a specified time to stop recording automatically in a period of time.

- Pressing the REC/OTR button repeatedly will increase the record time in 30 minute increments. Depending on the recording quality you selected, each time you press the button, the recording time will cycle through:

REC → +30 min → +60 min
 ↗ +120 min ↖ +90 min ↘

To resume to regular recording

Press RECORD/OTR button until "REC" appears on the screen.

To stop OTR (One Touch Recording)

Press STOP button to stop recording and the set time.

8 Press STOP on the remote to stop recording.

"WAIT" will appear on the TV screen, and wait until "LIVE" appear on the TV screen.

"LIVE" showing on the TV screen means recording has completed. Note: This may take up to 1 minute to complete.

9 Press TV→DVDR on the remote to switch to DVD mode.

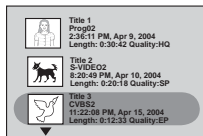
You will see the "DVD" appears on the screen following by the title menu as the illustration at left

10 Press ▲/▼ to choose the title you just recorded.

11 Press ►/◀ to playback.

It can show three title boxes on the TV screen at one time. If there are more than three title boxes, press ▼ to the next title box.

Video Plus+ Recording

1 Press Timer in the stop mode to display the menus.

2 Press ▼ to select “Video Plus+” and press ►/◄.

An empty space appears to let you enter the number.

3 Input the Video Plus+ code number via the remote control, then press ►/◄.

Check your local newspaper or TV programme guide for Video Plus+ code corresponding to the programme you want to record for your area. If you want to correct the number. Press ◀ button to erase the number or press CLEAR button to re-enter the number. Press ►/◄ to confirm and save the number.

4 Input the Video Plus+ Programme number .

You can find the Video Plus+ Programme number next to the Video Plus+ code number in your TV programme guide.

5 Press ►/◄.

The programme summary appears. You can move ◀/▶ buttons on the remote control to highlight and change the option for recording, then Press ►/◄.

6 Press ►/◄ again.

A programme list with 8 entries information appears. You can move ▲/▼ buttons on the remote control to select each entry for editing, then press ►/◄.

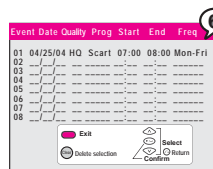
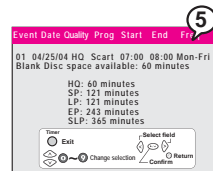
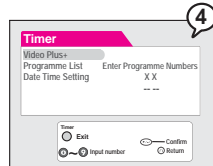
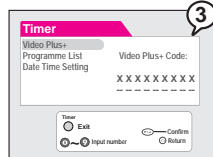
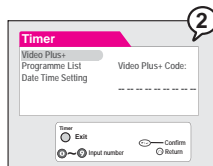
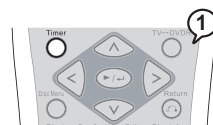
After finishing the schedule recording, a reminder message “Press Standby for timer recording” will appear on the screen. You have to press the POWER button on the remote control to power standby mode. Only by doing this, the timer recording will be complete.

Press  to exit from Timer setup screen.

Timer Recording

1 Press Timer in the stop mode to display the menus.

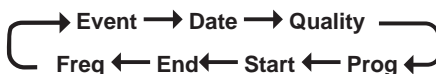
2 Press ▼ to select “Programme List” and press ►/◀.

3 Press ▲/▼ to select one entry, then press ►/◀.

This DVD Recorder provides up to 8 entries for schedule recording.

4 Press ◀/▶ to select the item you want to change and press ▲/▼ or number buttons to change the setting, then press ►/◀.

Press ► to scroll through the following items.



Example:

Event	Date	Quality	Prog	Start	End	Freq
01	04/25/04	HQ	(Start)	07:00	08:00	Mon-Fri

Press ▲/▼ to select the source of your A/V signals. If you choose to record from TV programs, enter the TV channel number by pressing number buttons.

The default setting will be shown on screen for your reference after you select and enter one entry.

5 Press Power button to standby mode.

⚠ Important:

After finishing the schedule recording, a warning message “Switch unit to Standby and wait for recording” will appear on the screen. You have to press the POWER button on the remote control to power standby mode. Only by doing this, the timer recording will be complete.



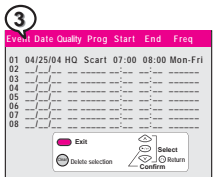
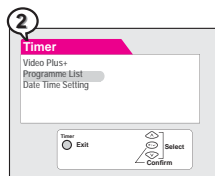
- Make sure Date and Time of this DVD Recorder be the same as your local time. If not, check Date/Time Setting to correct it. (Refer to [Timer Setup section](#))
- Before schedule recording, remember to put a recordable DVD+RW or DVD+R (with free space) disc into this DVD Recorder. If not, you can't do any recording even though schedule recording has set up.
- While schedule recording, make sure POWER of this DVD Recorder is always on.

To return to the Setup MENU screen

Press button.

To finish the setup operation

Press to exit from Timer setup screen.





To Record From External Source

Preparations:

1. Please connect this DVD Recorder to your TV, and connect outer equipment to this DVD Recorder. (For details please refer to the Quick Guide.)
2. Remember to use an open and recordable DVD+RW or DVD+R disc.

1 Turn on this DVD Recorder and external equipment.

2 Press EJECT to open the disc tray.

3 Place a recordable DVD+RW or DVD+R onto the disc tray.

Hold the disc without touching its surface, position it with the printed title facing up, align it with the guides, and place it in its proper position.

4 Press EJECT again to close the disc tray.

If you use an unused DVD+RW or DVD+R disc, the first reading will take about few seconds. If this DVD Recorder reads a new DVD disc, you will be asked to format the disc following the screen. If this DVD Recorder reads a used DVD disc, a Title menu will show the available title for play and available space left for recording.

5 Press TV→DVDR on the remote control to switch to TV mode.

You will see "Live" appear on the TV screen.

6 Press SOURCE on the remote control to toggle different external A/V input sources.

Press SOURCE repeatedly to scroll through various A/V input, including: TV, Scart, CVBS1, CVBS2, S-Video1, and S-Video2.

7 Press REC/OTR on the remote control to start to record.

"REC" will appear on the TV screen.

8 Press STOP on the remote control to stop recording.

Displaying the Scene With a Larger and Closer View

The ZOOM function enables you to take a closer look at the scene while you are watching a movie.

- 1 Press ZOOM during playback, a zoom window box will appear on the top left side of the screen.
- 2 Press ZOOM a number of times to see the scene in different size.
- 3 Press ◀/▶ / ▲/▼ to choose the preferred scene to see it in different sizes: Zoom x2, Zoom x4 and Zoom x8.

To return to normal playback

Press ZOOM a number of times until the zoom window box disappears.

Changing Audio Soundtrack Language

You can change the audio language from the one selected at the initial settings to a different language, if available. (This operation functions only with discs on which multiple audio soundtrack languages are recorded.)

- 1 Press AUDIO during playback, a audio window box will appear on the top left side of the screen.
- 2 Press ▶/◀, the audio window box turns yellow.
- 3 Press ▲/▼ to select the preferred language.
- 4 Press ▶/◀.

To return to normal playback

Press AUDIO until the box disappears.

For your reference:




- When the preferred language is not selected even after pressing ▲/▼ button several times, it may indicate that the language is not available on the disc.
- When you turn on or remove the disc, this DVD Recorder will play back the language which is selected at the initial setting. If you select a language which is not recorded on the disc, this DVD Recorder will play back a prior language programmed on the disc.





Clearing/Changing Subtitles

If a disc provides subtitles, you can choose to hide or change them. (This operation works only with discs that provide subtitles.)

- 1 Press SUBTITLE during playback, a subtitle window box will appear on the top left side of the screen.**
- 2 Press , the subtitle window box turns yellow.**
- 3 Press  to hide or change subtitles.**
- 4 Press .**

The subtitle window box will turn white.

To return to normal playback

Press SUBTITLE until the subtitle window box disappears.







- In some cases, the subtitle language may not change immediately to the selected one.

For your reference:

- When the preferred subtitle language is not selected, it may indicate that the language is not available on the disc.

Viewing From Another Angle

- 1 Press ANGLE during playback, the angle window box will appear on the top left side of the screen.**
- 2 Press , the angle window box turns yellow.**
- 3 Press  to select the preferred viewing angle.**
- 4 Press .**

The angle window box will turn white.

To return to normal playback

Press ANGLE until the angle window box disappears.



- ANGLE will only function on discs where different angles have been recorded.
- The viewing angles are shown on the player's display and you can select one from them for viewing.





2-4 Other Functions-continued

Using a DVD Menu

Some DVD discs have unique menu structures called DVD menus. For example, DVDs programmed with complex contents provide guide menus, and those recorded with various languages provide menus for audio and subtitle language. Although the DVD menu's contents and operation vary from disc to disc, the following explains basic operation when this feature is used.

1 Press TITLE.

The DVD menu available on the disc now appears.

2 Press ◀/▶/▲/▼ to select the preferred item.

3 Press ▶/◀.

You now enter to the selected item.

To enter other menu screen

Repeat steps 2 and 3.

To return to the previous menu screen

Press TITLE.

Using the Menu Function

1 Press MENU.

A DVD chapter menu with brief broadcast of each paragraph now appears. You may see the introduction of each chapter and then decide with which chapter to start first.

2 Press ◀/▶/▲/▼ or number button(s) to select the preferred item.

Handling Precautions

- Hold the disc by the edges so the surface will not be soiled with fingerprints. (A)
Fingerprints, dirt and scratches can cause skipping and distortion.
- Do not write on the label side with a ball-point pen or other writing utensils.
- Do not use record cleaning sprays, benzine, thinner, static electricity prevention liquids or any other solvent.
- Be careful not to drop or bend the disc.
- Do not install more than 1 disc on the disc tray.
- Do not try to close the disc tray when the disc is not installed properly. (B)
- Be sure to store the disc in its exclusive case when not in use.

If the surface is soiled (C)

Wipe gently with a soft, damp (water only) cloth.

When wiping discs, always move the cloth from the center hole toward the outer edge.

(If you wipe the discs using a circular motion, circular scratches are likely to occur, which will cause noise.)

If the disc is brought from a cold to a warm environment, moisture may form on the disc

Wipe this moisture off with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth before using the disc.

Improper disc storage

You can damage discs if you store them in the following places:

- Areas exposed to direct sunlight
- Humid or dusty areas
- Areas directly exposed to a heat outlet or heating appliance

- DVD, DVD+RW, DVD+R, DVD-RW, DVD-R, VCD, SVCD, CD-DA, Mixed CD-DA, MP3, WMA Audio CD, JPEG file disc and Kodak Picture Disc.

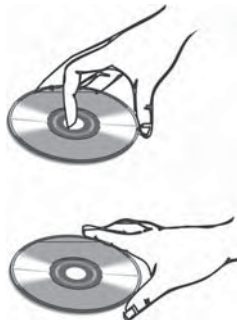

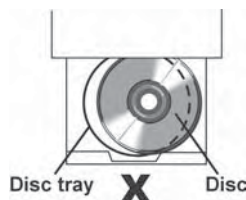
Maintenance

- Be sure to turn the unit off and disconnect the AC power cord before maintaining the unit.
- Wipe this unit with a dry soft cloth.
If the surfaces are extremely dirty, wipe clean with a cloth which has been dipped in a weak soap-and-water solution and wrung out thoroughly, and then wipe again with a dry cloth.
- Never use alcohol, benzine, thinner, cleaning fluid or other chemicals. And do not use compressed air to remove dust.

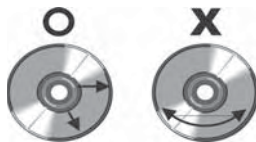

Angle

Recorded onto some DVD discs are scenes which have been simultaneously shot from a number of different angles (the same scene is shot from the front, from the left side, from the right side, etc.). With such discs, the ANGLE button can be used to view the scene from different angles.

Chapter Number

These numbers are recorded on DVD discs. A title is subdivided into many sections, each of which is numbered, and specific parts of video presentations can be searched quickly using these numbers.

DVD

These refer to a high-density optical disc on which high-quality pictures and sound have been recorded by means of digital signals. Incorporating a new video compression technology (MPEG II) and high-density recording technology, DVD enables aesthetically pleasing full-motion video to be recorded over long periods of time (for instance, a whole movie can be recorded).

DVD has a structure consisting of two 0.6 mm thin discs which are adhered to each other. Since the thinner the disc, the higher the density at which the information can be recorded, a DVD disc has a greater capacity than a single 1.2 mm thick disc. Since the two thin discs are adhered to each other, there is the potential to achieve double-sided play sometime in the future for even longer duration play.

DVD+R

This means DVD+Recordable. These Discs can be recorded and finalised only once.

DVD+RW

This means DVD+ReWritable. These Discs can be recorded on repeatedly.

Subtitles

These are the printed lines appearing at the bottom of the screen which translate or transcribe the dialogue. They are recorded on DVD discs.

Time Digit

This indicates the play time which has elapsed from the start of a disc or a title. It can be used to find a specific scene quickly. (It may not work with some discs.)

Title Number

These numbers are recorded on DVD discs. When a disc contains two or more movies, these movies are numbered as title 1, title 2, etc.

Track Number

These numbers are assigned to the tracks which are recorded on audio CDs. They enable specific tracks to be located quickly.
