Important Safeguards

For your own safety read following instructions carefully before attempting to connect this recorder to the mains.

Mains Supply: 230V ~ 50Hz - AC only

This unit is designed to operate on a **230V~50Hz** supply only. Connecting it to other power sources may damage it. Ensure that the supply corresponds to the information on the rating label at the rear of the recorder.

This component system may be fitted with a non-rewireable plug. If it is necessary to change the fuse in a non-rewireable plug the fuse cover must be refitted. If the fuse cover becomes lost or damaged, the plug must not be used until a replacement, available from the manufacturer, is obtained. It is important that the colour of the replacement fuse cover corresponds with the colour marking on the base of the plug.

If the plug needs to be changed because it is not suitable for your socket, or becomes damaged, it should be cut off and an appropriate plug fitted following the wiring instructions below. The plug must then be disposed of safely, as insertion into a 13A socket is likely to cause an electrical hazard.

IMPORTANT

The wires in the mains plug should be connected as shown in the diagram.

The colours of the wires in the mains lead of the unit may not correspond with the coloured markings identifying the terminals in your plug. Connect them as follows:-

The wire which is coloured blue must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter 'N' or coloured black.

The wire which is coloured brown must be

connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter $\mbox{'L}$ or coloured red.

There should be no connection to the earth terminal of your plug.

If a 13 Amp (BS 1363) Plug is used, a 3 Amp Fuse must be fitted, or if any other type of Plug is used a 3 Amp or 5 Amp Fuse must be fitted, either in the Plug or Adaptor, or on the Distribution Board.



This symbol means that this unit is double insulated. An earth connection is not required.

Getting Started

The Remote Control

Installing the batteries

Locate the remote control, and remove the battery cover. Insert two AAA size batteries into the compartment.

Note: Refer to the diagram inside the battery compartment for correct installation of batteries.



We recommend the use of Alkaline batteries.

Using The Remote Control

To use the remote control, point it at the front of the DVD Recorder, towards the sensor situated to the right of the DVD drawer.

The remote control has a range of up to 6 metres from the DVD Recorder and at an angle of up to 60 degrees.

Do not block the path of the beam from the remote control to the DVD Recorder.

Note: Sunlight or very bright light will reduce the remote control sensitivity.



• Turn the power off to your TV / Recorder before making any connections.

Connecting to a TV



*Note: Only use one of the above mentioned options 1 or 2 to connect the recorder to your TV otherwise it will cause picture interference.



Connecting to a SKY Box

• Turn the power off to your TV / Recorder before making any connections.







Connecting to a TV Using S-Video Cable

If your TV has a S-Video or S-VHS (super video) Input , connect this DVD Recorder's S-Video socket to your TV's S-Video In socket, this will provide a better viewing result on TV. Make sure to set Video Output Settings to S-Video from VIDEO Setup Screen.







Connecting to a TV Using Component Video Cable

If your TV has Component Video input, connect this DVD Recorder's Cr Y Cb sockets to your TV's Cr Y Cb In sockets, this will obtain the best viewing result. Make sure to set Video Output Settings to RCA Component from VIDEO Setup Screen.





Connecting to an AV Amplifier

When you're playing a DVD with digital surround sound tracks, you can either connect this player to a compatible digital sound decoder or an AV amplifier (for models that support built-in decoding) if the disc was recorded in Dolby Digital format.



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Connecting to Other AV Equipment



* You can connect to a VCR or Camcorder, or other AV device using RCA Audio Video cable.

Connecting Antenna

CAUTION:

- To prevent noise pickup do not place the Loop or FM wire aerial on the system or near other appliances.
- Place the aerials away from the unit for better reception. If the MW/FM wire aerial are placed near the AC power lead, it may cause interference in radio.



Use 75 coaxial cable (not supplied) to connect the unit to an outdoor FM antenna as shown in the right figure.





Connecting Speakers

CAUTION:

- Be sure to connect with the black wire to the minus (-) terminal and another line to the plus (+) terminal on the speakers and the unit. If the wires are reversed, the sound will be distorted and will lack bass.
- Do not mix the right speaker and left speaker when connecting the speakers to the unit.
- Unplug the AC power cord from the AC power outlet before connecting or disconnecting any component.



For your reference:

- After making all the connections of the system and AC power cord, you can output a test tone to check
 that all the speakers are connected correctly. For details on outputting a test tone, refer to "Video/Audio
 Setup" section on page 64.
- To obtain the best dynamic surround sound, locate the speakers at the best listening position with an appropriate distance and height of each speakers.
- Adjust the volume of all of the speakers by using remote control for the best surround sound. For details, please refer to "Sound Effect" section on page 74.
- When you select an item to adjust the volume, the sound cuts off for a moment.

Getting Started

1 Press the STANDBY/ON button on the DVD recorder or the Power button on the remote control to turn on your DVD Recorder.

The power LED is green on.



2 Turn on your TV, and switch it to the correct Video In channel.



3 Press **EJECT** to open the disc tray. Place a disc onto the tray.

Hold the disc without touching its surfaces, position it with the printed title side facing up on the disc tray.



- 4 Press EJECT again to close the tray. The DVD Recorder starts playback.
- **5** If it does not start playback, do the following:
 - If playing a DVD/DVD+R/DVD+RW, a disc menu appears. Press $\triangleleft / \triangleright / \land / \lor$ to select the preferred title and press
 - If playing an Audio or MP3 CD, Press **>**/+ to start playback.

6 Press + Volume - buttons on your TV to adjust the volume.

7 To stop playback, press the **STOP** button.

To view other functions available for disc playback, please refer to Chapter 2: DVD.



1-1 Before Recording



This chapter mainly show you how to record DVD discs from external sources using the remote control. Some of the functions can also be done by using OSD Settings shown on the TV. Please refer to Chapter 4-2: RECORD/DISC Setup for details.

- Before Timer recording, check the date and time setting again to make sure the information of the date and time is correct. Please refer to Chapter 4-5 Timer Setup for more details.
- Make sure this Recorder is connected to external equipment correctly. Please refer to "Connecting External Equipment" section for more details.
- This Recorder is only compatible with DVD+R or DVD+RW discs for recording.

POOR RECORDINGS: To prevent ruined recordings always check on the following:

- 1. Always purchase good quality / named branded discs's. Some cheap / unbranded discs may give rise to skipped / portions of the recordings to be missed.
- 2. It is essential that the discs are kept clean from finger prints and scratches. Always put the disc back into its holder when not in use.
- 3. A feature of this DVD recorder is that it will carry on recording over scratches / blemishes or badly made disc's. On play back of the recording this will show as parts of the recording being skipped. This is NOT A FAULT OF THE PLAYER but a disc problem. Replace the disc with a new one if this occurs.

Record Quality Setting

- **1** Press **Rec. Quality** button on the remote control. A Record Quality dialog box appears on the screen.
- 2 Press Rec. Quality button repeatedly to cycle through the preferred record quality.
 - HQ (High Quality): to record about one hour
 - SP (Standard Play): to record about two hours

For example, DVDs programmed with complex contents provide guide menus, and those recorded with various languages provide menus for audio and subtitle language. Although the DVD menu's contents and operation vary from disc to disc, the following explains basic operation when this feature is used.

1 Press TITLE.

The DVD menu available on the disc now appears.

After finishing the schedule recording, a reminder message "Press Standby for timer recording" will appear on the screen. You have to press the **POWER** button on the remote control to power standby mode. Only by doing this, the timer recording will be complete.

6-1 Sound Effect

Setting Audio Sound Effect

You can output the sound with an acoustical effect as Normal, Jazz, Pop, Classic, Dance and Rock.

1 Press the EQ button repeatedly to select the wished sound effect.

The sound effect item you select now states play.

Setting Speaker Sound Balance

You can manually adjust the sound balance on Front Right, Front Left, Rear Right, Rear Left, Centre, Subwoofer, Treble, and Bass speakers.

- **1** Press the CH Sel button repeatedly to toggle to the wished Speaker.
- **2** Press VOL +/- to adjust the speaker volumes. The scale of volume goes from +6 to -6. The sound is louder toward +6, and quiter toward -6.
- **3** Repeat Step 1 to 2 to adjust the volumes of the following "Rear Right", "Rear Left", "Centre", "Subwoofer", "Treble" and "Bass" speakers.

7-1 Troubleshooting



Before requesting service for the DVD Recorder, check the chart below for a possible cause of the problem you are experiencing. Some simple checkups or a minor adjustment on your part may eliminate the problem and restore proper operation.

SYMPTOM (COMMON)	REMEDY
No power.	 Insert the power plug securely into the power outlet. Check if the ON/OFF button on the front of the player is set to on. Check if no power at the AC outlet by plugging in another appliance for a test.
The player does not start playback when PLAY is pressed.	 Condensation has formed: wait about 1 to 2 hours to allow the player to dry out. This player cannot play discs other than DVDs and audio CDs. Check if the disc is defective by trying another disc. Check the region (local) code.
The player starts playback but stops immediately.	The disc may be dirty and may require cleaning.Ensure that the disc is installed with the label side up.
No picture.	 Ensure that the equipment is connected properly. Ensure that the input setting for the TV is "Video". Check if the TV is on. Select the same channel and source on the TV as on the player.
No sound.	 Ensure that the equipment is connected properly. If using a HiFi amplifier, try another sound source. Check the Audio Output Setting menu to make sure that Analog Output is selected.
Distorted sound.	 Ensure that the input settings for the TV and stereo system are proper. No sound is heard during still picture (pause) or slow-motion playback.
No audio at Digital Output.	 Check the digital connections. Check the settings menu to make sure that the digital output is set to on. Check if the audio format of the selected audio language matches your receiver capabilities.
Distorted picture.	 Check the disc for fingerprints and clean with a soft cloth, wiping from centre to edge. Sometimes a small amount of picture distortion may appear. This is not a malfunction.
Completely distorted picture or no color in picture.	The disc format is not according to the TV-set used (PAL/NTSC).
Picture is distorted during rapid advance or rapid reverse.	• The picture will be somewhat distorted at times: this is normal.
No rapid advance (or rapid reverse) playback.	Some discs may have sections which prohibit rapid advance (or rapid reverse).
No 4:3 (16:9) picture.	Choose the correct setup "Aspect Ratio" item which matches the TV set used.
No operations perform with the remote control.	 Check the batteries are installed with the correct polarities (+ and -). The batteries are depleted: replace them with new ones. Point the remote control unit at the remote control signal sensor and operate. Operate the remote control unit at a distance of not more than 7 meters from the remote control signal sensor. Remove the obstacles between the remote control unit and remote control signal control signal sensor.

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7-2 Disc Handling and Maintenance

Handling Precautions

- Hold the disc by the edges so the surface will not be soiled with fingerprints. (A) Fingerprints, dirt and scratches can cause skipping and distor-
- tion. Do not write on the label side with a ball-point pen or other writing utensils.
- Do not use record cleaning sprays, benzine, thinner, static electricity prevention liquids or any other solvent.
- Be careful not to drop or bend the disc.
- Do not install more than 1 disc on the disc tray.
- Do not try to close the disc tray when the disc is not installed properly. (B)
- Be sure to store the disc in its exclusive case when not in use.

If the surface is soiled (C)

Wipe gently with a soft, damp (water only) cloth.

When wiping discs, always move the cloth from the centre hole toward the outer edge.

(If you wipe the discs using a circular motion, circular scratches are likely to occur, which will cause noise.)

If the disc is brought from a cold to a warm environment, moisture may form on the disc

Wipe this moisture off with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth before using the disc.

Improper disc storage

You can damage discs if you store them in the following places:

- Areas exposed to direct sunlight
- Humid or dusty areas
- Areas directly exposed to a heat outlet or heating appliance

Playable disc format

DVD, DVD+RW, DVD+R, DVD-RW, DVD-R, VCD, SVCD, CD-DA, Mixed CD-DA, MP3, WMA Audio CD, JPEG file disc and Kodak Picture Disc.

Recordable disc format

- DVD+RW (Application Programme)
- DVD+R

Maintenance

- Be sure to turn the unit off and disconnect the AC power cord before maintaining the unit.
- Wipe this unit with a dry soft cloth. If the surfaces are extremely dirty, wipe clean with a cloth which has been dipped in a weak soap-and-water solution and wrung out thoroughly, and then wipe again with a dry cloth.
- Never use alcohol, benzine, thinner, cleaning fluid or other chemicals. And do not use compressed air to remove dust.

For Your Reference



Angle

Recorded onto some DVD discs are scenes which have been simultaneously shot from a number of different angles (the same scene is shot from the front, from the left side, from the right side, etc.). With such discs, the ANGLE button can be used to view the scene from different angles.

Chapter Number

These numbers are recorded on DVD discs. A title is subdivided into many sections, each of which is numbered, and specific parts of video presentations can be searched quickly using these numbers.

DVD

These refer to a high-density optical disc on which high-quality pictures and sound have been recorded by means of digital signals. Incorporating a new video compression technology (MPEG II) and high-density recording technology, DVD enables aesthetically pleasing full-motion video to be recorded over long periods of time (for instance, a whole movie can be recorded).

DVD has a structure consisting of two 0.6 mm thin discs which are adhered to each other. Since the thinner the disc, the higher the density at which the information can be recorded, a DVD disc has a greater capacity than a single 1.2 mm thick disc. Since the two thin discs are adhered to each other, there is the potential to achieve double-sided play sometime in the future for even longer duration play.

DVD+R

This means DVD+Recordable. These Discs can be recorded and finalised only once.

DVD+RW

This means DVD+ReWritable. These Discs can be recorded on repeatedly.

Subtitles

These are the printed lines appearing at the bottom of the screen which translate or transcribe the dialogue. They are recorded on DVD discs.

Time Digit

This indicates the play time which has elapsed from the start of a disc or a title. It can be used to find a specific scene quickly. (It may not work with some discs.)

Title Number

These numbers are recorded on DVD discs. When a disc contains two or more movies, these movies are numbered as title 1, title 2, etc.

Track Number

These numbers are assigned to the tracks which are recorded on audio CDs. They enable specific tracks to be located quickly.
